SEGRUE PRIZE

John Segrue was a foreign correspondent for the Daily New Chronicle. As a journalist working in Central Europe before and during the Second World War he took a principled stand against Nazism at great personal risk. Listed in the gestapo Black Book, he was eventually captured by the Nazis during the German advance into Yugoslavia. Treated as a prisoner of war, he died in Stalag 8 on 11 September 1942. The Segrue family donated his book collection and that of his son Brian Segrue, also a distinguished journalist, to the Library and established this prize.
