

Exporting to EndNote® from Proquest databases

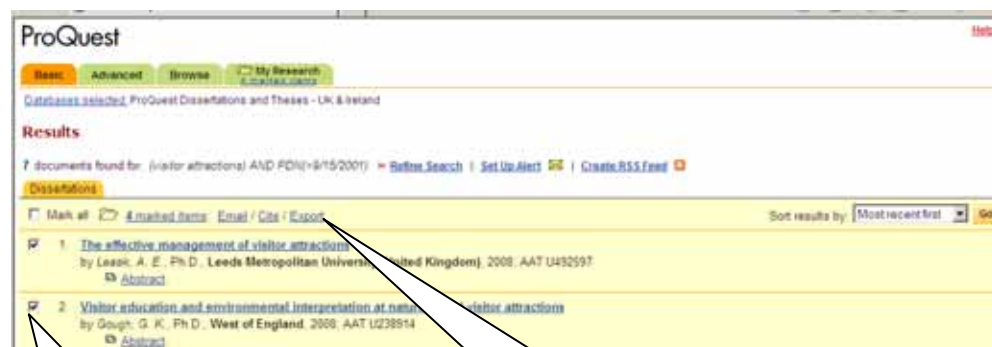
1. THE SCOPE OF THIS GUIDE

Exporting from online databases into your EndNote Library is a key feature of EndNote, and a quick and efficient way to build your EndNote Library. This guide takes you through exporting from **Proquest** which provides access to the following databases:

- British Periodicals
- DAAI: Design and Applied Arts Index;
- Proquest Dissertations and Theses (PQDT)

2. DOWNLOADING FROM PROQUEST

After you have completed your search follow these steps to download the references you want.



Mark the references you wish to export

Click on the export button




Chose export directly to EndNote

You will be given the choice to export to EndNote or EndNote Web

ProQuest will automatically start EndNote if it is not already open.

Your references will appear in Endnote in Imported References and Unfiled
