


Exporting to EndNote® from ScienceDirect

1. THE SCOPE OF THIS GUIDE


Exporting from online databases into your EndNote Library is a key feature of EndNote, and a quick and efficient way to build your Endnote Library. This guide takes you through exporting from **ScienceDirect**.

2. EXPORTING FROM SCIENCEDIRECT TO ENDNOTE


After you have completed your search follow these steps to Export your references.
