

Your journey begins at our main reception in Poole House.

Poole House is the central hub, and if you take a look around you'll find staff offices, seminar rooms and facilities for the Faculty of Science & Technology.

Our food labs can be found in the neighbouring Thomas Hardy Suite.



Just to your left is **The Base**, home to our AskBU Students' Service. Our advisers are on hand with information, advice and guidance. You can also pick up a prospectus from here.

In **Poole House**, you will also find our new **Open Access Centre** with over 60 computers available 24/7, as well as our IT Services offering support.

Now head back past reception towards The Atrium.



Welcome to **The Atrium Café**, often buzzing with student campaigns and activities. Will you spot all the many different cafés on campus?



If you're not stopping for a coffee, have a browse around **Blackwell's bookshop** (open during term time), the **Students' Union Shop** or pop into **Santander**.



If you're feeling creative, you might like to go upstairs to **The Atrium Art Gallery** and **Balcony** to visit our latest art exhibition. You may find people socialising, holding study sessions or meeting for workshops.

Head down the corridor opposite Blackwell's. If you keep walking, you'll spot our Faculty of Management's sports lab.



If you head up the stairs to the first floor, your next stop is **Dylan's Kitchen** & **Bar**, which is used as a place to relax and catch up with friends between lectures. In the evenings a range of events bring the place to life. From (competitive) quiz nights to karaoke, not forgetting Guess the Intro Bingo, Dylan's offers some of the best student deals around on food and drink.

Make your way downstairs and head back towards The Atrium.
Continue past the Students' Union Shop and through the double doors leading outside.







Look to your left and you'll see a selection of lecture theatres. If there are no lectures taking place, feel free to pop in and have a look around.

Go back outside and continue walking away from Poole House. To your right you will see our Student Centre, which is your next stop. Head up the steps and go inside.

As you enter the **Student Centre**, you'll see **SportBU** on your right-hand side. If you'd like to have a look at the facilities on offer, just ask at reception to see for yourself.

Inside SportBU you'll find a high spec gym zone, four-court sports hall, dance studios and rehabilitation treatment rooms. We certainly recommend taking a few minutes to have a look around.







Once you've explored SportBU, head back into the Student Centre where you'll discover designated areas for welfare, democracy, equality and our very own purple army (SUBU reps).





On the first floor you'll find SUBU (our Students' Union), which represents and provides services to all BU students. At the heart of the student experience, SUBU also provides volunteering opportunities, clubs, societies and part-time work. **SUBU Advice** (on the second floor) provides free, confidential and independent advice to existing and prospective students on issues from academic worries to housing and finance. You'll also find SUBU's student-run radio station and magazine, Nerve Media, on the fourth floor. Listen carefully and you may hear Nerve Radio being played in the centre.





If you visit the third floor, you'll see our beach hut technobooths.

For those who want the best view of Talbot Campus, only the top floor will do.

# Go back outside and cross the courtyard area. Follow the footpath in front of you until you see Kimmeridge House.



If there are no classes taking place, feel free to explore the lecture theatres and seminar rooms. Kimmeridge House often plays host to events, conferences and degree shows.



Just across from Kimmeridge House, you'll spot the **Biodome**, which is used for plant growth research.



You'll also notice one of our secure cycle compounds. We encourage our staff and students to help protect the planet and there is an extensive network of cycle paths connecting our campus to the surrounding areas.

### Now head back to the main walkway and follow signs to **Dorset House.**





On your way, you'll pass The Graduate School on your left, which exists to provide support to our postgraduate students and operates an open-door policy.

**Dorset House** is home to the **Faculty of Management**, including a **Professional Engagement Suite** for students to interact with industry and pitch their own ideas, events and functions. There are also a number of labs, project and microscope rooms for the Faculty of Science & Technology.



## Walk beyond Dorset House until you see Weymouth House on your left. Go inside.









To the left of reception, you will see a live studio set, which includes a stage and interview area.

The ground floor also houses our High Definition TV Studio, news journalism studio and café, as well as the kit room and support desk where students can hire equipment.









On the floors above you will find the computer animation studios, radio studios, video editing suites, post production suite, desktop publishing studio and art room.

### When you leave Weymouth House, you'll see our new Fusion Building straight ahead.



The Fusion building offers 27 new seminar rooms, three lecture theatres, research space, a 24 station PC laboratory, roof-top terraces and numerous catering facilities, topped with a glass dome roof.





When you've finished exploring The Fusion Building, head back outside and turn right. Continue along the path with the car park on your right.

You'll soon find Christchurch House on your left. the home of the Faculty of Science & Technology, which alongside PC labs, an artefact store and field equipment, houses our zooarchaeology, osteoarchaeology and chemistry labs. You'll also find the Peach Tree common room, and staff offices. Christchurch House is also home to our Forensic Crime Scene Training Centre.





After you've taken a tour of Christchurch House, make your way to the back of the car park. The building on your left is Tolpuddle House.

Inside Tolpuddle House, you will find a variety of facilities, including manufacturing workshops for our Product Design students and a motion capture studio. The Tolpuddle Annex buildings house further seminar rooms.





Continue across the car park, following signs to **Talbot House.** 





Talbot House is the main hub for our student support and welfare services. Inside you'll find The Music Centre, which features a suite of teaching and practice rooms. Individual music lessons are available, while students and staff can also join a range of ensembles. You will also find the Multi-faith Chaplaincy, Student Wellbeing Service and Medical Centre. Both students and staff also have access to childcare facilities at our Ofsted-registered nursery. Finish your tour of Talbot House in the Student Hall, a popular venue for a variety of events including music ensemble rehearsals.

# As you leave the Student Hall, you will see the Student Village on your left.



The **Student Village** is our on-campus accommodation and features 3-7 bedroom, self-catered, shared houses.

There's much more accommodation at our Lansdowne Campus, which is a short bus ride away.



# Re-trace your steps across the car park, following signs to The Sir Michael Cobham Library and The Edge.



The Edge is the home of our Careers & Employability Service, where you can make one-toone appointments with a Careers Adviser, find out about the Student Development Award and Global Talent Programme, explore part-time jobs and get information about developing your employability.

Feel free to explore The Sir Michael Cobham Library. Students have access to electronic, print and multimedia resources with staff on hand for support. There is a photocopying and printing area plus over 300 PCs and technobooth learning spaces.

If you want to explore resources for the subject you'd like to study. just ask the library staff.

On the ground floor, you'll find Additional Learning Support (ALS), which offers specialist one-to-one support for specific learning differences, sensory and physical impairments, medical conditions. and mental health. ALS also offers an impartial advisory service. including information about Disabled Students' Allowances (DSA).



The next stop is the first floor, where you'll see the postgraduate study area and Language Centre.



Leave the library and head back to Poole House to end your tour. If you'd like to take the scenic route, use the walkway from the library third floor across to the Student Centre.



We offer a subsidised bus service between the Talbot and Lansdowne campuses and the surrounding areas. The UNIBUS service runs every ten minutes between campuses during term times
