BU UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS POLICY AND PROCEDURE 2015-16

1. Scope and Purpose

- 1.1 Bournemouth University offers a range of undergraduate scholarships in order to reward high achievement. Details of the scholarship benefits, eligibility to apply and deadline for applications are listed in Section 5 of this document. Scholarships will be reviewed on a regular basis and the University reserves the right to introduce new Scholarships or to cease the award at any time.
- 1.2 The overarching purpose of offering scholarships is to attract talented students to BU by lowering or removing the financial barrier to study. They can be broken into three broad types that apply across home/EU and overseas markets:
 - a) Recognising Achievement: To recognise academic achievement or other talents (e.g. sport, music) and encourage students to continue to make a strong contribution in these areas
 - **b)** Recognising Partnership: To recognise a special relationship with partner academic institutions and (sponsor) business organisations and encourage loyalty to BU from influencers at that institution
 - c) Tactical Recruitment:
 - a. To open up new markets and / or send a signal that BU welcomes applications from those markets (e.g. Vietnam; or BTEC applicants) by using scholarships as part of an integrated campaign to raise BU's profile in those markets and market segments
 - b. To incentivise applications to courses that need additional numbers and would benefit from a raised profile
 - c. To reduce the financial barrier for those who would otherwise be unable to take up a place
- 1.3 The criteria for eligibility for each scholarship have been approved by Bournemouth University's Fees Board. The Scholarships Implementation Group (SIG), on behalf of the Fees Board, oversees the implementation and administration of all University Scholarships.
- 1.4 Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of merit as defined within each scholarship category only and will not be means tested or otherwise influenced by any other award/grant held by the scholarship applicant.
- 1.5 Scholarships are awarded to students studying full-time on the BU campus only. Students studying at BU Partner Colleges are not eligible.
- 1.6 In order to aid conversion, if applicant is not successful in obtaining the scholarship award(s) they have applied for, an alternative scholarship offer can be recommended as appropriate by International Marketing & Student Recruitment Team (IMSRT) or the relevant awarding committee.
- 1.7 Eligibility criteria and exclusions apply to each scholarship category and are subject to review. Any changes will apply to the entire cohort in the relevant academic period (2015-16). Any change to the detriment of an applicant will be reviewed by SIG with recommendations to the Fees Board.
- 1.8 Scholarships can be withheld or adjusted to reduce an outstanding debt to Bournemouth University.

2. Overarching principles & eligibility

- 2.1 With the exception of the BU International Partnership, BU International Partnership Excellence Scholarships and Discretionary in-country awards, students can only be in receipt of one BU scholarship in any given year (Academic, Music or Sport). Eligibility criteria for each category of scholarship are laid out in Section 5.
- 2.2 With the exception of the BU Sports and Music Scholarships, scholarships will be awarded for the first year of study at BU only. Students repeating units/years on an existing course or starting again as a first year on a new course will not be eligible.
- 2.3 A successful student will only be eligible to receive one award for the highest value unless they specifically request otherwise, for example preferring to receive the Academic Excellence Scholarship in place of another, higher award, for which they will have applied.
- 2.4 Entrants will only be eligible for the scholarship framework in the year-of-entry, including deferrals.
- 2.5 Where relevant completed application forms should be submitted electronically at www.bournemouth.ac.uk/scholarships, or to askBU by email at askBUstudents@bournemouth.ac.uk, or by post to: The Base, Talbot Campus, Fern Barrow, Poole, BH12 5BB UK.
- 2.6 Consideration will be given to all applications that meet the published criteria for each scholarship category provided the application is received before the published deadline.
- 2.7 Applications for undergraduate scholarships received after the published deadlines set will not normally be considered.
- 2.8 Students will typically be notified of the outcome of their application within 1-2 weeks of the published deadline.
- 2.9 BU International College (BUIC) applicants are eligible to apply for BU scholarships, subject to meeting the relevant criteria for each individual award.

3. Appeals & Complaints

3.1 Unsuccessful applicants wishing to appeal should write to the Quality & Enhancements Officer within 10 working days of being notified of the outcome of their application stating clearly the grounds for appeal.

3.2 Appeals will only be considered where there is evidence that a procedural irregularity has occurred in processing the application. Appeals against the University's judgement of the merit of an applicant against the published criteria will not be accepted.

4. Payment of awards

- 4.1 With the exception of the Academic Excellence and Music and Sports Scholarships (see below) all scholarships are paid via a reduction in fees, or full waiver of tuition fees.
- 4.2 Academic Excellence Scholarships

Scholarship awards for UK and EU students will be paid in nine equal instalments via pre-payment MasterCard. Normally, the first instalment (12%) will be loaded onto the card in mid-October. The remaining eight instalments (11%) will be loaded onto the card from November to June.

Scholarship awards for Non EU students will be made by fee reduction.

4.3 BU Music and Sports Scholarships

Depending on the scholarship, awards can consist of a range of cash awards, or the provision of tuition, coaching, equipment, or funding for competitions and travel expenses.

5.1 BU Academic Excellence Scholarship (UK/EU/non-EU) - ABB or equivalent* (see below)

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: Eligible courses delivered on the BU campus

Fee Category: UK, EU, Non-EU

Level of Study:

UK/EU: Undergraduate Honours Year 1 (Level C) – excludes NHS funded and Top-up

Non-EU: First year of study (Level C, I, H)

Criteria: Must be studying on an Undergraduate – Bachelor's Degree (excluding NHS funded

courses and post-registration/professional courses – see exclusions)

A Levels - Grades ABB or Distinction, Distinction, Merit (DDM) at BTEC Level 3 Extended

Diploma or above or equivalent (*see below)

or

Equivalent other non-UK qualifications (**see below)

Value of award: UK/EU: £1,500 Pre-payment card (UK/EU) (see 5.2)

Non-EU: £2,000 fee reduction (Non EU) (see 5.2)

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

All students joining the University in September 2015 (including any deferrals) who meet the University's published eligibility criteria for an Undergraduate Academic Excellence Scholarship will receive the award.

Students can only be in receipt of one scholarship in each category (Academic, Music & Sport). The university will award the scholarship of the greatest value by default, however students that meet the eligibility for two awards (e.g. Academic Excellence, Vice-Chancellor's award) could indicate their preference to receive the AES award if preferred.

In the majority of cases the scholarship awards will be confirmed automatically once the University has received the student's results via UCAS.

In those instances where qualifications are not picked up automatically, for instance non-UK, then applicants will have until the end of the first academic year of study to provide evidence of their qualifications to the University for consideration.

The University will also consider qualifications achieved that pre-date the existing year of entry so long as the overall profile meets the published criteria for the year of entry.

For international (non-EU) students joining Level I or a top-up degree in Level H, the criteria of this award may consider additional higher qualifications such as successful completion of a UK Higher National Diploma (HND) with an overall merit profile or equivalent level overseas qualification, if the Secondary School result is below the criteria**

*Refer to Appendix 1 for BU grade equivalents to ABB. For the purposes of scholarship awards BU only recognises the qualifications as outlined in Appendix 1. BU will also consider a UK Master's degree qualification or higher (or overseas equivalent) when a minimum grade of 60%/Merit (or overseas equivalent grade) has been achieved, as meeting the requirement for an Academic Excellence award.

5.2 BU International Partnership Scholarship

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: Eligible courses delivered on the BU campus

Fee Category: Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (Year 2 and Top-up).

Criteria: Students must be studying at one of BU's formal partner universities overseas and be

resident in the relevant country at the time of application. A Memorandum of

Understanding (MoU) and/or Recognition Agreement will be in place between BU and the

overseas partner.

At the time of writing, BU overseas partners include Beijing Normal University Zhuhai China, (BNUZ); Universitas Bina Nusantara (BINUS) Indonesia and University of

Economics and Law (UEL), Vietnam.

Value of award: £2,000 fee reduction

^{**}Non-UK qualifications will be assessed against the UK equivalencies using BU's International Qualifications Database.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

All students joining an eligible programme at the University in September 2014 from a formal overseas partner institution, as outlined in section 5.2, will automatically receive the award. This will be in the form of a tuition fee reduction.

5.3 BU International Partnership Excellence Scholarship

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: Eligible courses delivered on the BU campus

Fee Category: Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (Year 2 and Top-up).

Criteria: Students must be studying at one of BU's formal partner universities overseas and be

resident in the relevant country at the time of application. A Memorandum of

Understanding (MoU) and/or Recognition Agreement will be in place between BU and the

overseas partner.

At the time of writing, BU overseas partners include Beijing Normal University Zhuhai China, (BNUZ); Universitas Bina Nusantara (BINUS) Indonesia and University of

Economics and Law (UEL), Vietnam.

Students will be applying for courses as outlined in section 5.2.

Value of award: £3,000 (one award per overseas partner institution) fee reduction

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

The scholarship will be automatically awarded to the student from the eligible overseas institution that has the highest GPA score on entry to BU. In the event that two students have the same GPA score, then their IELTS score will also be taken into consideration. In the event that there are two identical profiles (GPA and IELTS) then an additional award will be made.

The award is in the form of a tuition fee reduction.

The recipient of the BU International Partnership Excellence Scholarship will also automatically receive the £2,000 BU International Partnership Scholarship.

5.4 Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship – most promising applicant (Access to HE; BTEC; STEM; International)

5.4.1 Most promising applicant (Access to HE)

Place of Attendance: BU campus (excludes BU Partner Colleges)

Fee Category: UK

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours Year 1 (excludes courses funded by the NHS and Top-up

courses)

Criteria: Have achieved/are predicted to meet or exceed the entry requirements for chosen BU

course through studying an Access to Higher Education qualification.

Students will be required to complete an application form and personal statement, outlining

what makes them an outstanding applicant for BU (see section 2.5).

Value of award: Full tuition fee waiver of Year 1 fees (£9,000). Excludes any repeat units/years.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

One scholarship is available for September 2015 entry.

Applications must be submitted by 31 July 2015.

An awarding committee will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and actual results. The committee will then make recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor who will ultimately decide on the successful applicant.

5.4.2 Most promising applicant (BTEC)

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours Year 1 (excludes courses funded by the NHS and Top-up

courses)

Criteria: Have achieved/are predicted to meet or exceed the entry requirements for chosen course

through studying a BTEC qualification.

Students will be required to complete an application form and personal statement, outlining

what makes them an outstanding applicant for BU (see section 2.5).

Value of award: Full tuition fee waiver of Year 1 fees (£9,000). Excludes any repeat units/years.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

One scholarship is available for September 2015 entry.

Applications must be submitted by 31July 2015.

An awarding committee will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and actual results. The committee will then make recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor who will ultimately decide on the successful applicant.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

One scholarship is available for September 2015 entry.

Applications must be submitted by 31 July 2015.

An awarding committee will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and actual results. The committee will then make recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor who will ultimately decide on the successful applicant.

5.4.4 Most promising applicant (International)

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus (excludes BU Partner Colleges)

Fee Category: Applicants classified as 'overseas' for fee purposes are eligible to apply

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours Year 1 (excludes courses funded by the NHS and Top up

courses)

Criteria: This scholarship is offered to students who have applied to study a full-time undergraduate

(Bachelor) degree at BU and who are resident in one of the following countries at the time

of application: China, Hong Kong, Kazakhstan, Russia and Vietnam.

Students must be able to demonstrate an exceptional academic profile from high school studies (or higher), as assessed by IAT using BU International Qualification database.

Students will also be required to complete an application form and personal statement,

outlining what makes them an outstanding applicant for BU.

Value of award: Full tuition fee waiver of Year 1 fees. Excludes any repeat units/years.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

One scholarship is available for September 2015 entry.

Applications must be submitted by 31 May 2015.

An awarding committee will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and actual results. The committee will then make recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor who will ultimately decide on the successful applicant.

5.5 BU Sports Scholarship

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus (excludes Partner Colleges)

Fee Category: UK/EU/Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (any level), excludes placement year.

Criteria: Students must be able to demonstrate that they are a talented sportsperson and have a

desire to continue to develop sports skills, as well as their academic profile.

They will be expected to represent their chosen sport at national or junior international

level or be able to demonstrate the potential to compete at this level.

Selection Process: Applicants applying for a scholarship in a varsity sport will need to attend BU trials to be

assessed by the coach.

All applicants need to ensure that references are sent alongside their application. This must be a sealed sporting reference from a high performance coach or National Governing

Body.

All scholarship decisions will be made before the end of October 2014.

Value of award: A range of Sport Scholarships may be awarded. Awards can consist of a range of cash

awards, or the provision of coaching, equipment, funding for competitions:

(£500-£1000 range of award)

The athlete will be a talented sportsperson and have the desire to continue to develop in the sporting arena as well as academically. The applicant will be expected to be representing their sport at national or junior international level (or equivalent thereof) or be able to demonstrate the potential to compete at these levels.

(£1000- £5000 range of award)

The elite athlete will be expected to be representing their sport at an international level of competition (or have done within the previous two years) and have the potential to reach world-class performance level. They will be, or

previously have been, on World Class support and recognised by their National Governing Body.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

The deadline for early applications is 30 September.

Scholarships will be paid for the first year of study and may be continued for subsequent years of study (excluding placement year) providing students continue to meet the criteria.

The awards will reflect the key priority sports areas for BU. Full details can be found in the Appendix.

5.6 The sportBU EXCEL Sports & Performance Scholarship

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus (excludes Partner Colleges)

Fee Category: UK/EU/Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (any level), excludes placement year.

Criteria: Scholarships are available to talented athletes in all sports within the British Universities

and Colleges Sport (BUCS) domestic programme.

Generally students should demonstrate excellence in sport at national or international level

of competition.

Value of award: No monetary value is attached to this scholarship, the EXCEL Scholarship provides

athletes with the following:

Free gym membership

Free strength and conditioning training

Free weekly 30 minute sports massage therapy treatment

Free chiropractic treatments

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

The EXCEL Scholarship is applied for annually and athletes need to apply at the start of each academic year.

Students can qualify for both the BU Sports and sportBU EXCEL Scholarships in the same year.

The deadline for applications is the 30 September.

5.7 Music Scholarships

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: UK/EU/Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours Year 1

Criteria: Students must be able to demonstrate that they are a talented instrumentalist or vocalist,

and have been involved in ensemble activity.

To be considered for the major award students will need to have reached at least Grade 8 of the Associated Board or the equivalent level in their main instrument/voice. As well as

have an academic grounding in music, such as A-level or Grade 8 theory.

Students must also demonstrate how they wish to develop musically, as well as

academically.

Value of award: Two types of Music Scholarship may be awarded:

A Major award is worth £1,000 A Minor award is worth around £300.

Scholarships can be paid in kind (tuition and equipment) or in cash.

Scholarships will be paid for the first year of study and may be continued for subsequent years of study (expect placement years) providing students continue to meet the criteria.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion

The deadline for applications is 15 November.

All students who are shortlisted will be invited to an audition.

Students will be expected to take regular lessons on their main instrument or voice with one of the University's tutors and the cost of lessons will be deducted from the scholarship fund at source.

6.8 Discretionary In-country Awards

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: Non-EU

Level of Study: Undergraduate

Criteria: BU applicants who have been interview in-country by a member of International Marketing

and Student Recruitment Team (IMSRT) and who have been recommended for this award for conversion purpose. It can be awarded in addition to another BU scholarship that has

been already offered.

Value of award: £2.000.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

This is tactical recruitment scholarship aimed at reducing the financial barrier for those who would otherwise be unable to take up a place of study at BU.

Recommendation is made by a member of IMSRT who has interviewed the applicant in-country.

6. Tracking, reporting and monitoring on scholarships

AskBU Student Services team manage an administrative overview of applications received and track progress with Schools and professional services.

An annual report on the overall number and value of scholarships awarded via funding classifications and scholarship category to be presented to BU's Fees Board in March.

7. Budgets

A table identifies the BU funding source for each category of scholarship is found in the Appendix (internal only).

8. Disclaimer

Scholarships will be reviewed on a regular basis and the University reserves the right to introduce new Scholarships or to cease the award of Scholarships at any time.

For the purposes of Academic Excellence Scholarship, BU recognises only those equivalent qualifications as outlined in the table in Appendix 1.

Original exam certificates must be presented for this assessment to take place.

Level 3 qualifications not listed above will be considered by exception and application by the student. An applicant must achieve qualifications of sufficient breadth and depth of study equivalent to a minimum of 320 points, with a minimum of 100 points (B) in three single qualifications as assessed using the published UCAS tariff and BU equivalent weightings (e.g. 2 A levels at grade B and the Welsh Baccalaureate). Applicants presenting such a combination will not be automatically assessed and should contact askBU Current Students who will assess the qualifications. Original exam certificates must be presented for this assessment to take place.

BU will also consider a UK Master's degree qualification or higher (or overseas equivalent) when a minimum grade of 60%/Merit (or overseas equivalent grade) has been achieved, as satisfying the qualification requirements for an Academic Excellence award.

An assessment of the qualifications will be undertaken to determine eligibility. Original exam certificates must be presented for this assessment to take place.
