BU SCHOLARSHIPS POLICY AND PROCEDURE 2018-19: Postgraduate

1. Scope and Purpose

- 1.1 Bournemouth University (BU) offers a range of postgraduate scholarships in order to reward achievement. Details of the scholarship benefits, eligibility to apply and deadline for applications are listed in Section 6 of this document.
- 1.2 The overarching purpose of offering scholarships is to attract talented students to BU by lowering or removing the financial barrier to study. Scholarships can be broken into three broad types:
 - a) **Recognising Achievement:** To recognise academic achievement or other talents (e.g. sport, music) and encourage students to continue to make a strong contribution in these areas to encourage high calibre applicants to BU and build BU reputation as a result.
 - b) **Recognising Partnership:** To recognise a special relationship with partner academic institutions and (sponsor) business organisations and encourage loyalty to BU from influencers at that institution.
 - c) **Tactical Recruitment:**
 - To open up new markets and / or send a signal that BU welcomes applications from those markets by using scholarships as part of an integrated campaign to raise BU's profile in those markets and market segments
 - To incentivise applications to courses that need additional numbers and would benefit from a raised profile
 - To reduce the financial barrier for those who would otherwise be unable to take up a place.
- 1.3 The criteria for eligibility for each Scholarship are approved by Bournemouth University's Fees Group. The Scholarships Implementation Group (SIG), on behalf of the Fees Group, oversees the implementation and administration of all university Scholarships. This Policy implements the Scholarships Framework Proposal 2018/19 approved at Fees Board in April/May 2017.
- 1.4 Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit as defined within each scholarship category and will not be means tested or otherwise influenced by any other award/grant held by the scholarship applicant.
- 1.5 If an applicant is not successful in obtaining the scholarship award(s) they have applied for, an alternative scholarship offer can be recommended as appropriate by International Marketing & Student Recruitment Team (IMSRT) or the relevant awarding committee.
- 1.6 Scholarship awards can be deferred within an academic year i.e. from September to January but not to the following academic year.
- 1.7 Eligibility criteria and exclusions apply to each scholarship category and are subject to review. Should SIG identify the need for changes to the criteria or terms and conditions of any scholarship, a proposal for the change with rationale and impact identified is submitted to the Service Owner (SO) for approval and to the Fees Board for final ratification. Any change will be communicated to all enquirers and applicants giving due notice of such change and published information amended. Any changes will apply to the entire cohort in the relevant academic period.

3. Application process and eligibility

- 3.1 All awards specified in this policy are applicable to full-time, BU campus-based postgraduate students only. Students studying BU validated programmes at other institutions, or on Distance Learning and part-time programmes are not eligible. BU International College (BUINTCOL) applicants are eligible to apply for BU scholarships for their BU degree, excluding any preparatory programme, subject to meeting the relevant criteria for each individual award. **Note:** Integrated Masters students are only eligible to be considered for the Scholarship provision relevant to year of entry, that is at undergraduate level and therefore are **not eligible** for the Postgraduate Scholarship framework.
- 3.2 With the exception of the BU International Partnership, Subject Achievement Scholarship and discretionary in-country awards students can only be in receipt of one academic scholarship. However, eligible students may receive a sports or music scholarship in addition to an academic scholarship. Eligibility criteria and exclusions for each category of scholarship are laid out in Section 6.
- 3.3 With the exception of the BU Sport and Music Scholarships, scholarships will be awarded for the first year of study at BU only. Students repeating units/years on an existing course or starting again as a first year on a new course will not be eligible.
- 3.4 All PGT Scholarships represent a tuition fee discount/waiver, based on the published full fee amount with the exception of Music and Sport Scholarships.
- 3.5 A student will only be eligible to receive one academic award for the highest value unless they specifically request otherwise. If a student is unsuccessful, they may be recommended for other suitable awards, subject to funds remaining (normally at a lower value). The awarding Faculty then decides if an award will be offered in such cases.
- 3.6 All students enrolling to study in a particular year, including those students who have deferred their entry from the previous year, are eligible for the scholarship framework offered for the enrolment year only. Students who commenced and subsequently suspended their studies, having partial scholarship funding, will be eligible for the remainder of that award if they recommence studies with BU.
- 3.7 Academic Excellence Scholarships, Discretionary In-country Scholarships and International Partnership Scholarships are awarded automatically if the conditions are met by the applicant, without the need for a separate application process to be completed. All other scholarships require a separate application to be made.
- 3.8 The application process is set out on the BU website and completed application forms should be submitted electronically at www.bournemouth.ac.uk/scholarships. Alternative application formats are available on request, by contacting our Future Students Enquiry Team (01202 961916).
- 3.9 Consideration will be given to all eligible applications provided the application is received before the published deadline. Applications for scholarship received after the published deadlines will not normally be considered.
- 3.10 Students applying for an award which is automatically assessed and where additional evidence or self-identification is required, must provide such evidence before 31 January (September entrants) or 30 June (January entrants).
- 3.11 Students will typically be notified of the outcome for awards that require applications, within 20 working days of the published deadline. Due to the number of applications, it may only be possible to contact successful candidates.
- 3.12 Communication of changes to scholarship provision, eligibility criteria, amount or any other major or minor details will be made to any affected applicants or potentially eligible students. Applicants or affected potentially eligible

students will be provided 30 days' notice of the change and their rights to appeal, as per BU's Student Financial Support Appeal Procedure.

4. Appeals

- 4.1 Unsuccessful applicants wishing to appeal should write to the complaints@bournemouth.ac.uk within 10 working days of being notified of the outcome of their application stating clearly the grounds for appeal.
- 4.2 As per the Student [Financial Support Appeal Procedure](#) document
- 4.3 (see: <https://www1.bournemouth.ac.uk/students/help-advice/important-information>), appeals will only be considered where there is evidence that the process of decision making in respect of an application did not follow the prescribed procedures; or where pertinent new information is available which was not included in the original application and which materially affects the application. Re-assessment of income will not be considered as pertinent information. Appeals against the University's judgement of the merit of an applicant against the published criteria will not be accepted.

5. Payment of scholarship awards

- 5.1 With the exception of the Music and Sports Scholarships, all PGT scholarships are paid via a reduction in tuition fees/full fee waiver of the published tuition fee, typically processed in advance of online enrolment and subject to students providing confirmation of actual grades at enrolment.
- 5.2 BU Music & Sports Scholarships: Depending on the scholarship, awards can consist of a range of financial awards, or the provision of tuition, coaching, equipment, or funding for competitions and travel expenses and additional support services (e.g. massage, lifestyle, chiropractic treatment etc).
- 5.3 If scholarship recipients pay their remaining tuition fees in full before or at the enrolment, they are entitled to the 5% discount based on the full price tuition fee.
- 5.4 Scholarship payment is made subject to confirmation of enrolment and participation on a monthly basis, for the sports and music scholarship, this is reviewed and managed throughout the academic year based on engagement and maintaining levels.

6. Scholarship Categories

6.1 BU Postgraduate Academic (Excellence) Scholarships

Mode of Attendance: Full time only (part-time and distance learning are not eligible)

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: UK, EU, non-EU

Level of Study: Postgraduate (Taught Master's), including CPE and LPC, and Master's by Research (MRes).

Criteria:

- 1) UK/EU: UK Bachelor Honours Degree 2.1 or equivalent**; CPE with a merit profile (for LPC entry)
- 2) Non-EU: Equivalent overseas qualification of a UK Bachelor Honours Degree of higher 2.1 (65%+)**; CPE with a merit profile (for LPC entry)

Exclusions: Postgraduate Diplomas, post-registration and professional courses, part-time programmes and distance-learning programmes are excluded from this award. All courses in the Faculty of Health & Social Sciences are excluded, with the exception of MSc Public Health, MA Social Care, MA Social Work and MSc Nutrition & Behaviour.

Value of award: 1) UK/EU: £2,000 fee reduction
2) Non-EU: £3,500 fee reduction

**Non-UK qualifications will be assessed against the UK equivalency using BU International Qualifications database. Details can be obtained from the International Admissions Team at internationaladmissions@bournemouth.ac.uk

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

- i. All eligible students joining the University in September and January (including any deferrals entering in September/January) who meet the University's published eligibility criteria for a Postgraduate Academic Excellence Scholarship will receive the award.
- ii. A student's fee status (UK including Channel Islands/Isle of Man, EU or Overseas (Non-EU)) will be used to determine the criteria for the award that they may be eligible for.
- iii. In the majority of cases the scholarship award will be confirmed once the University has received the student's confirmed results as evidence uploaded in the myHub student application. Students awaiting final grades will be provisionally awarded the scholarship on the basis of their predicted grades, should they meet the award criteria. Evidence must clearly state a 2.1 or equivalent for UK/EU applicants, or 65% or equivalent for non-EU applicants (equivalent as identified by BU International Qualifications database).
- iv. Any student who has not received a confirmation of their scholarship will have until 31 January (for those enrolling in September) and until 30 June (for those enrolling in January) to provide evidence of their qualifications to the university for consideration.
 - i. All students must present original certificates for all qualifications at enrolment, or scholarships may be withdrawn.
 - v. An equivalency document benchmarking the above classification for the most frequently received non-UK qualifications has been produced by the International Marketing & Student Recruitment Team (IMSRT) and is published on BU website in the following sections:

- vi. For applicants who hold both Bachelor's and Master's/PhD degrees, if their Bachelor's degree is marginally below the threshold but their higher degree has met the criteria, the Academic (Excellence) Scholarship can be awarded.
- vii. The university will also consider a Master's degree or higher (or overseas equivalent) gained at a UK institution when a minimum grade of 60%/Merit (or overseas equivalent grade) has been achieved, as meeting the requirement for an Academic Excellence award.
- viii. Students entering CPE or LPC programmes directly and those progressing from CPE to LPC will be eligible for the award so long as they satisfy the criteria.

6.2 International Partnership Scholarship

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: Non-EU

Level of Study: Postgraduate (Taught Master's)

Criteria: Students will be automatically awarded the scholarship providing they are studying at one of BU's formal partner universities overseas and be resident in the relevant country at the time of academic course application. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and/or Recognition Agreement will be in place between BU and the overseas partner. Students will be applying for a Taught Master's degree in The Faculty of Media and Communication.

Value of award: £2,000 fee reduction

Eligible partners: Communications University China (CUC)*

* (Colombia partners are covered under the Colombia Partnership Scholarship in "Opportunity Scholarships" with a different amount offered).

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

All students from CUC and Jai Hind College joining a Taught Master's Degree in The Faculty of Media and Communication in September each year will automatically receive the award in the form of a tuition fee reduction.

6.3 BU Executive Dean's Scholarships (full-time & part-time course)

Mode of Attendance: Full time (and one part-time award by the Business School, see table below)

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: UK, EU, non-EU

Level of Study: Postgraduate (Taught Master's). MA Public Health only for Faculty of Health and Social Sciences award. LPC course in Faculty of Management is excluded in the Dean's award.

Criteria: Minimum UK Undergraduate (Bachelor's Honours) degree with 2i classification or equivalent*. Students will be required to complete an application form and personal statement, outlining what makes them an outstanding applicant for BU.

Value of award: 50% tuition fee waiver (and a total of £3,000 for the one part-time award).

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

All Applications must be submitted by 31 May 2018 for September 2018 entry and 18 November 2018 for January 2019 entry. The UK and IAT Admissions team will review applications focusing on the student's personal statement and academic results, before making recommendations to the academic faculty – who will ultimately decide on the successful applicants.

6.4. Opportunity Scholarships

Criteria:	BU applicants who have been interview in-country by a member of International Marketing and Student Recruitment Team (IMSRT) and who have been recommended for this award for conversion purpose. It can be awarded in addition to another BU scholarship that has been already offered.
Value of award:	Varies

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

This is targeted scholarship aimed at reducing the financial barrier for those who would otherwise be unable to take up a place of study at BU.

Recommendation is made by a member of International Marketing & Student Recruitment team who has interviewed the applicant in-country. The award will be applied as part of the admissions function and advised by the International Student Recruitment Manager.

6.5. Public Health Scholarship

Place of Attendance:	BU campus

Level of Study:	Postgraduate (Taught Master's), MSc Public Health only
Criteria:	All unconditional offer holders by 1 June 2018 for this course for September 2018 entry will be offered the scholarship.
Value of award:	25% fee reduction

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

IMSRT will flag this on the applicants' record so that finance can pick up the report to adjust student account. Applicable to all MSc Public Health applicants holding an unconditional offer by 1 June 2018.

There are two awards available for September 2018 entry. Deadline for application is 1 April 2018. Recipients of this scholarship cannot be in receipt of any other BU scholarship. for thesis or dissertation, an excess baggage allowance, and a monthly personal living allowance.

Partner organisation, in this instance Bournemouth University, is liable for 20% of the tuition fee with the FCO paying 80%.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

Candidates who are shortlisted are interviewed by the British Embassy or High Commission in their home country.

Criteria: Must be applying to join MA International Political Communication course that starts in September/October.
Must be a citizen of a Chevening-eligible country at the time of application and intend to return there at the end of the period of study.
Hold an Undergraduate degree that is equivalent to at least an upper-second class honours degree in the UK.
Must have achieved the minimum Chevening English language requirement (minimum IELTS (Academic) 6.5 with minimum 5.5 in each component) or equivalent.
Must have completed at least two years' work experience before applying.

Value of award: Chevening Scholarships are funded by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) and partner organisations. This Scholarship includes tuition fees, travel to and from home country, and a monthly personal living allowance.

Partner organisation, in this instance Bournemouth University, is liable for the fee waiver with FCO providing the living allowance

6.9 BU Sports Scholarship (First year)

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: Eligible courses on the BU campus

Fee Category: UK/EU/Overseas (Non-EU)

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (any level) & Postgraduate, excludes placement year.

Criteria: Scholarships are offered to students who have applied to study at Bournemouth University and have received an offer and accepted their place, completing a minimum of 60 credits in that year.
The applicant must demonstrate excellence in their chosen sport, and be part of Regional, National and/or International squad and compete at that level. Individual athletes will also need to be competitive with top performers within the BUCS programme.

The applicant must evidence a commitment to continue to develop in their sporting arena and to fully engage with our support programmes.

The applicant must ensure their application is supported by a reference from a High Performance Coach or National Governing Body coach, those who are applying for a sport that sits outside our performance BUCS programme will need to ensure that two references are sent alongside their application.

Selection Process: All applicants need to complete the online application by 31 August 2018.

Initial Panel meeting 10 days after closing date, outcomes of any awards will be communicated within 7 days and/or further clarification given if required.

Second Panel meeting 10 days after trials to finalise all remaining awards and final communication to scholars before the end of October

Applicants applying for a scholarship in a performance sport will need to attend BU trials to be assessed by the coach.

Applications must be accompanied by a sealed sporting reference from a High Performance Coach or National Governing Body, those who are applying for a sport that sits outside our varsity programme will need to ensure that two references are sent alongside their application

All scholarship decisions will be confirmed by a panel decision, with confirmation and trials before the end of October.

Value of award: A range of Sports Scholarships packages may be awarded which can comprise financial support and/or in-kind provision services (SportBU) as detailed below:

- Cash awards range from £500-£5000
- Free Gym membership
- Strength & Conditioning coaching
- Sports massage
- Chiropractic treatment
- Performance workshops (nutrition, anti-doping, performance mind sets, media training etc)
- Lifestyle sport

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

- i. The deadline for applications is 31 August 2018 (September entrants) or 30 November 2018 (January entrants).
- ii. Awards and award values are likely to reflect the key priority sports areas for BU. Full details can be found in Appendix 4.
- iii. The award and continued eligibility for the BU Sports Scholarship are on the condition that the student adheres to the terms and conditions of the scholarship agreement.
- iv. Scholarships will be paid for the first year of study and may be continued for subsequent years of study (excluding placement year) providing students continue to meet the criteria below.
- v. Scholarships renewal is subject to continued eligibility. Students must:
 - a. Be continuing their studies with BU, completing a minimum of 60 credits per year

- b. Continue to meet your sporting profile of the original application and maintain all responsibilities outlined in the Terms & Conditions and advise any relevant changes to the original application especially on sections 1, 3, 5 & 6
- c. Attend a meeting with the Sports Performance Manager before the end of October to identify/clarify development goals and performance aims and how the scholarship will assist this season and to attend pre-Season S&C sessions starting 1st & 2nd week of September.
- d. Provide details of training and performance program whilst not in attendance at BU (May to September or whilst on placement). Must show attendance to at least 75% (sport specific) & 85% (S&C) training sessions from previous season and what improvements have been made.

6.10 Music Scholarships

Mode of Attendance: Full time

Place of Attendance: BU campus

Fee Category: UK/EU/Overseas (Non-EU)

Level of Study: Undergraduate Honours (any level) & Postgraduate, excludes placement year.

Criteria: Students must be able to demonstrate that they are a talented instrumentalist or vocalist, and have been involved in ensemble activity.

To be considered for the major award students will need to have reached at least Grade 8 of the Associated Board, Trinity or LCM in their main instrument/voice. Additionally, as applicants should have an academic grounding in music and have passed A-level (C or above) or Grade 8 theory.

Students must also demonstrate how they wish to develop musically, as well as academically. It is expected that scholars will work towards higher level musical qualifications.

Value of award: Two types of Music Scholarship may be awarded:

A Major award is worth £1,150 (considered for those who fulfil the criteria above)

A Minor award is worth around £450 (considered for those who meet some or almost meet the criteria above. Fees to cover the cost of music tuition only).

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion

- i. The deadline for applications is 31 August 2018 (September entrants) or 30 November 2018 (January entrants). Subject to available funds, the deadline may be extended and publicised through the scholarship webpages.
- ii. All students who are shortlisted will be invited to an audition.
- iii. All music scholars are expected to attend weekly lessons with one of the University's specialist tutors, to attend ensembles and to participate in concerts and recitals. Lesson fees are deducted from the scholarship fund at source and, for major scholars, the residue is paid by cheque in three instalments throughout the academic year. This is on the condition that the student adheres to the terms and conditions of the scholarship agreement.

- iv. Scholarships will be paid for the first year of study and may be continued for subsequent years of study (except placement years) providing students continue to meet the criteria.

7. Withdrawals and Suspensions

- 7.1 Students must be fully enrolled at the time that the scholarship payment is due. No payment will be made to students who have interrupted or suspended their studies. Students who withdraw prior to the payment date will not be entitled to a pro-rata payment. Enrolment status is checked by the Finance and Performance Team on a monthly basis before triggering card payments and a termly basis for fee waivers.
- 7.2 If a scholarship recipient chooses to suspend their study their scholarship will be frozen. Payments commensurate with the remaining funding for that level of study will recommence when the student returns to study. Time limits apply to a frozen scholarship. Students are usually expected to recommence their studies within 18 months of the date of the suspension to receive the remaining funding.

8. Tracking, reporting and monitoring on scholarships

- 8.1 All 'automatic' awards (Academic Excellence) will be recorded in the Student Record System (SRS – SITS) for statutory reporting purposes. AskBU Student Services team will manage an administrative overview of competitive awards (by application) and track progress with decision boards.
- 8.2 An annual report on the overall number and value of all scholarships awarded via funding classifications and scholarship category will be presented to Fees Board in March of each year.
- 8.3 M&C will provide recommendations to the Fees Board, including feedback on scholarships provision, decision-making and award process.

9. Budgets

- 9.1 Funding for awards is approved by Faculty and central budgets. The source of each fund is identified in Appendix 7.
- 9.2 Financial control measures assume the regular checking of a 'random' sample of automatically assessed awards on a monthly basis. Competitive (by application) scholarships will be approved by default on receipt of the award shortlist and selection of the successful recipient(s).

10. Disclaimer

- 10.1 Scholarships will be reviewed on a regular basis and the University reserves the right to review, amend, and introduce new awards and to cease the award of scholarships at any time. A revised (minor) version of this document will be published to take account of any changes to our provision, the terms, conditions & eligibility.
 - 10.2 To ensure compliance with Competition & Markets Authority guidance in relation to the accuracy of information, the only permitted changes to online and printed information are through the Scholarships Implementation Group and from a major or minor version of this Policy & Process document. All changes will be approved by the Director of M&C as Service Owner.

Sporting Scholarship Agreement

between

The purpose of the Sporting Scholarship is to assist an athlete to fulfil their sporting potential whilst balancing their academic studies. The University expects recipients of a Sporting Scholarship (“Sports Scholar”) to adhere to their sporting responsibilities and meet the academic requirements of their chosen degree whilst at the University.

Bournemouth University Sport Scholarship Aims & Objectives

The overall aim of our Sporting Scholarship programme is to meet the key ambitions of our Sport Strategy and improve the sporting opportunities offered at Bournemouth University by supporting and engaging with performance athletes in order to assist the development of the University’s Sport Strategy through recruitment, recognition of student success, retention, and public engagement.

We aim to:

- Create a balance to enable Sports Scholars to excel whilst studying for a first class degree, develop their employability and to fulfil their sporting potential.
- Provide an athlete-centred approach for all Sports Scholars through regular contact with our Sport Development Manager.
- Promote the University as a world-class provider of education, training and research, as well as a provider of expert support services for sports professionals.
- Improve the awareness of how sport has an important impact on wellbeing.
- Assist in the recruitment, retention and development of athletes.
- Improve the ranking of the University in the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) leagues.
- Increase the profile and marketability of SportBU.

1 Terms of the agreement

This Sporting Scholarship Agreement must be read in conjunction with the Student Agreement to which you are bound by virtue of your enrolment on a course at The University. The terms of this Sporting Scholarship Agreement apply to you in addition to the terms of your Student Agreement, and in the event of conflict between the two agreements, the terms of the Student Agreement shall take precedence.

In consideration of the Sporting Scholarship received, you agree to the following terms:

- 1.1 to maintain a strong engagement with all aspects of your academic pathway and form good relationships with lecturers and course leaders. You must demonstrate a commitment towards studying at the University through attendance at timetabled course sessions and adherence to agreed course deadlines;
- 1.2 to demonstrate excellence in your chosen sport and be part of a Regional, National and/or International squad and compete at this level (individual athletes will also need to be competitive with top performers within the BUCS programme);
- 1.3 to attend, so far as is reasonably possible, preseason training which would start in the 1st or 2nd week of September;
- 1.4 to maintain your current performance level in training and competition and to challenge and aspire to continue developing to achieve long term goals or be able to demonstrate the potential to compete at these levels, as well as working towards agreed performance targets;
- 1.5 to continue to meet the sporting profile outlined in your original application and maintain all responsibilities;
- 1.6 to commit to, support, promote and participate fully in at least 75% of sport specific training sessions run by SportBU;
- 1.7 to commit to, support, promote and participate fully in at least 85% of strength and conditioning sessions run by SportBU;
- 1.8 to meet regularly (but, as a minimum, twice) throughout the season with the Sport Development Manager to carry out a needs analysis and establish a plan (weekly & annual) for the season and to show the desire to continue to develop in the sporting arena in all aspects of technical, tactical, physical, mental and lifestyle elements of your sport by completing a Sports Scholar Profile Template shared via Dropbox (weekly plan, annual plan, long term plan, development goals, performance aims, & finances);
- 1.9 to always portray the University & SportBU in a positive light and wear the SportBU or University Sports Scholarship kit (as applicable) at all competitions, when representing the University, at photo opportunities and at any other appropriate opportunities, or as directed by the Sport Development Manager;
- 1.10 to attend the initial scholarship welcome evening and other workshops provided by Sport BU throughout the season;
- 1.11 to represent the University in BUCS domestic championships for your sporting discipline and represent English Universities and/or British Universities when selected, unless National/International duties, University exams, injury or other extenuating circumstances (as notified to the Sport Development Manager) prevent this;
- 1.12 to be actively involved in your sport club at the University and to be an ambassador and role model to fellow athletes;
- 1.13 to be available for a minimum of three promotional events during their scholarship year that could include any of the following: Patrons welcome evening, open days, fresher fairs, press opportunities, interviews, sports specific recruitment events;

- 1.14 to update the Sport Development Manager with progress and achievements throughout the year and be willing to write blogs and/or vlogs prior/during/post events/competitions they are participating in to help with personal promotion and to raise the profile of the sporting provision at the University;
- 1.15 to abide by the rules of your sport and the code of conduct/ethics that has been agreed for or recognised by your National Governing Body (NGB);
- 1.16 to adhere to your NGB's anti-doping policies and regulations in addition to complying with the requirements of the WADA code.

2 Scholarships Benefits

The Sporting Scholarship package can be made up of any of the following and will be confirmed in writing to the individual.

- 2.1 Cash contribution of between £500 and £5000
- 2.2 Free SportBU gym membership
- 2.3 Strength and conditioning coaching & training
- 2.4 Sport related workshops
- 2.5 Personal lifestyle support from the Sport Development Manager
- 2.6 Specialist support services that can include by arrangement
 - 2.6.1 Chiropractic treatment
 - 2.6.2 Sports massage
 - 2.6.3 Physiology
 - 2.6.4 Nutrition
 - 2.6.5 Sport specific analysis

3 Monitoring and Evaluation

- 3.1 You must meet a minimum of twice during the Term with the Sport Development Manger to establish and maintain performance aims and developments goals.
- 3.2 You should be monitoring and evaluating your own performance on a regular basis and should consult with your coach for any clarifications and additional support.
- 3.3 You must complete the Sports Scholar Profile Document shared in the dropbox system to help evaluate progression, weekly timetables and annual plans.
- 3.4 The Strength & Conditioning register will be used to recognise attendance at additional support services.

4 Termination and Suspension

- 4.1 For the avoidance of doubt, the Sporting Scholarship will cease immediately in the event of you ceasing to be a student of Bournemouth University for whatever reason.
- 4.2 The University shall have the right (at its sole discretion) to amend, suspend or withdraw the award at any time in the event of material breach by you of the terms of either your Student Agreement or this Sporting Scholarship Agreement or if you (in the reasonable opinion of the Head of Sport Development) bring the University, SportBU, the Students' Union, your sport or any University official partners into disrepute.
- 4.3 If the financial element of any Sporting Scholarship provided to you is not (in the reasonable opinion of the University) used to aid your personal sporting performance and for what is considered to be personal benefit, the University shall be entitled to suspend or withdraw the that financial element with immediate effect.

- 4.4 The Sporting Scholarship awards are reviewed annually and therefore you must submit a new application each year to be considered for further scholarships. There is no guarantee of the same amount, or any amount, of Sporting Scholarship being awarded in any subsequent years of University study.
- 4.5 Notwithstanding anything else in this Clause 4, any alteration of the level of award will be decided via periodic review and will be at the discretion of the Sport Development Manager. In addition, the University shall have the right (in its sole discretion, but acting reasonably) to recover from you the whole amount (or any part thereof) of the financial element of any Sporting Scholarship already paid to you at the time of termination or suspension of the Sporting Scholarship.

5 Media Consent Form

- 5.1 You acknowledge that it is a condition of receiving a Sporting Scholarship that your consent is provided as detailed below.
- 5.2 Subject always to the University’s compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and any other applicable data protection legislation in force from time to time:
 - 5.2.1 You hereby consents to the use of any photographic image, video recording, audio recording or quote of you obtained whilst carrying out your duties as a Sports Scholar (collectively referred to as “Images”) by employees of the University or by agents authorised on behalf of the University.
 - 5.2.2 You also consent to the University releasing Images to any relevant NGB, BUCS, Sport England Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme and selected local clubs and organisations for marketing and publicity purposes.
 - 5.2.3 You acknowledge that Images will be stored in an online image bank at the University and could be used for marketing and publicity purposes by the University in publications including but not limited to, the University’s prospectuses, annual report/review, newsletters, course literature, advertisements, social media and websites.

Dear Music Scholar,

Congratulations on the award of your music scholarship for the coming year and I hope that you will enjoy all the opportunities that we have available for you.

Your scholarship is awarded on the condition that you make an **ongoing commitment to your personal musical development and to the musical life of the university**. To comply with these conditions, you must:

- Take weekly 30 minute instrumental lessons (25 lessons per annum) with one of the University's tutors. You can, of course, extend these to 1 hour lessons if you wish and the additional fees will be deducted from your scholarship fund. Any exam entry fees and accompaniment costs will also be deducted from your scholarship fund at source.
- In consultation with the Head of Music agree to participate in at least one ensemble from the following list and attend rehearsals and concerts regularly. You may, of course, attend more than one ensemble.
 - Chamber Choir
 - Orchestra
 - Big Band
- Perform in at least 5 major university concerts / recitals each year.
- Show evidence of progress on your main instrument/voice. For example, in year 1 you will be expected to have made significant progress towards achieving a first diploma from one of the recognised conservatoires.

Please be aware that your scholarship will be withdrawn if you fail to adhere to the conditions under which it was awarded. All funding is reviewed annually. To re-qualify for funds in the next academic year you will be asked to submit a written report giving details of your progress within the previous year and listing your contribution to BU Music. Your instrumental teacher will also be asked to supply a progress report.
