Your quide to Clearing

You can use the Clearing process to find any remaining university spaces to study this year. Whether you've already made an application and want to change your choice, didn't get the grades you expected or have simply decided that you do want to go to uni after all - this guide is for you.

What is Clearing?

Clearing is organised by UCAS. It is the final part of the university admissions process and is the last opportunity for you to find a place at university if you want to start this September.

Who is Clearing for?

Clearing is for students who:

- Haven't been able to secure their firm or insurance choice on UCAS
- Have changed their mind about their choices and want to 'shop around'
- Sent their application to UCAS after 30 June
- Want to make a new application to study this September.

When is Clearing?

The UCAS website will show Clearing vacancies from 5 July. Often universities will open earlier, and some may open nearer to A-level results day.

How do I find out which courses are in Clearing?

You will find the full lists of courses in Clearing:

- · On individual university websites
- On the UCAS website
- In the national press.

What can I expect from **BU through Clearing**

How does Clearing work?

If you're looking for a university place in Clearing, here's your step-by-step guide to what you need to do.



One

Visit the UCAS website: www.ucas.com

If you've not yet made a uni application, you'll need to register with UCAS and make an application, or check if universities accept direct applications. You'll receive a welcome email from UCAS to access Track once you submit your application. The email will contain vour Clearing number.

If you applied for uni earlier in the cycle and your grades aren't what you were expecting, you'll know you're in Clearing if Track says 'You are in Clearing' or 'Clearing has started'.

Use the 'Clearing checklist' on the following pages to make a note of the following:

- Your Clearing number
- · Your UCAS Track number.

Make a list of your qualifications and their UCAS Tariff points value



Three

Consider alternative institutions and courses - make a shortlist of courses you are interested in

You can find official Clearing course listings on the UCAS website, in the national press or on individual university websites. Make a note of the telephone number of the institution and the course you are interested in.



Get on the phone as early as possible -

Universities want to talk to you about your grades, study and other achievements. So it's important that you make the call to the university (not your friends or family).

- Ask about the course content, structure, assessment, placement opportunities and anything else that is important to you
- Listen to what they have to say. Ask if it's possible to visit them so you can get a feel for the university
- Remember it's not just about them choosing you, it's about you choosing them!



Five

Make your decision and add your Clearing choice on UCAS Track

Once you've considered all your options (use our scoring sheet in this Toolkit to help!), it's time to make your decision. Visit your Track 'choices' page on UCAS and click the 'Add a Clearing choice' button*. You will then be able to enter the institution code and course details by the date the university gave you on the phone. You can only make one choice - referring yourself means you've accepted the offer.

If you've applied directly to a university, they'll tell you what to do next.

* Please visit the UCAS website for the dates when you can refer yourself.



Six

Revisit the UCAS website to ensure your place has been confirmed

UCAS will let the university know that you have entered their details on Track. The university will check they've made you an offer and will update your application to show you have been accepted in your Track 'choices'. UCAS will also send you a letter to let you know your place is confirmed.

You need to contact universities to secure an offer before you can refer yourself. If you don't, you may not be accepted. If this happens, your 'Add a Clearing choice' button will appear again in Track.
