### Job Purpose

- 1. Help to provide a mixture of demonstrating support for lecturing staff by helping with the delivery of seminars, demonstrating in laboratory classes and on occasion and in collaboration with appropriate members of the academic staff undertake marking of assignments.
- 2. To support technical and programming support for experimentation using EEG, TMS, tDCS, eyetracking, ePrime, etc.
- 3. To contribute to the sustained excellence of a student learning experience in psychology.

NB The balance of responsibilities may vary from time to time and will be reviewed as part of the appraisal process.

### Main Responsibilities

#### **Students and Learning**

- Provide demonstrating support for academic staff by helping to deliver seminars, helping to plan and deliver laboratory classes and providing advisory support for students.
- Provide practical technical instruction and demonstrations in collaboration with appropriate members of the academic staff.
- Supervise students working in laboratories and any other relevant areas for which the Faculty has responsibility.
- Monitor student performance and on occasion and in collaboration with appropriate members of academic staff, undertake the marking of assignments.
- Help to develop practical exercises, demonstrations and other learning packages and aids for student use.
- Provide programming and technical support for ongoing research particularly where specialist equipment is used (initial training will be provided).

#### Other

• Carry out Faculty administrative duties as required.

- Maintain personal and professional development in line with an agreed appraisal programme in order to enhance personal contribution to learning and teaching and other relevant activities.
- To contribute to the sustained excellence of a student learning experience in psychology.
