

#### Your home from home

 You may choose to live in hospital accommodation at your placement location, as you will experience the full 24-hour shift pattern, including weekend and night shifts.

• If you are studying some of our Healthcare courses, you will require accommodation with a 50-week tenancy. We have specific options available, although shorter (40-42 weeks options) could be selected and you opt for an additional Summer let.

#### You have three main options

- Hospital accommodation (arranged direct)
- **Halls of Residence** (booked through BU)
- Shared houses (booked through BU/LettingsBU)
- You may not be informed of your placement location until Summer, but Hospital accommodation can be simple & easy to arrange





## The cost of study

£9,250 per year, Honours degree courses

- Tuition Fee Loan to cover <u>full</u> <u>amount</u>
- Students do not start repayment until income is over £27,295\*
- Fees will not change for duration of course
- You can pay the university directly in a single lump sum or two instalments





# The cost of living – 46-week courses

# Paying it back

- You will start repaying your combined loan amount automatically (by HMRC) in the April following graduation or leaving the course, only when you earn over the threshold.
- If any amount remains after **30 years**, it is written off.

Interest accrues on the loan from the moment you take it out.

### **NHS Training Grant**

£8,000 per annum

- **₹5,000**All students studying on eligible courses
- + £1,000
  Specialist disciplines
- £2,000
  Additional childcare allowance

#### **Eligible courses:**

Midwifery, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Operating Department Practice, Paramedic Science and Physiotherapy

- This funding does not need to be repaid
- Register for an online account via the NHS
   Learning Support Fund application system
   found on the NHS website
- You must apply within six-months of starting study
- Paid in three instalments intermittent with termly student loan payments
- You will need to reapply each year



# NHS Funding: BA (Hons) Social work

Up to £5,724 per annum

- £4,862\*
  Social work bursary rates 2021/22
- **£862\***Placement Travel Allowance

- This funding does not need to be repaid
- Eligible for students in their second and third year of study
- The number of bursaries are capped, so there is no guarantee
- You will need to apply via the MyFunding system at www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk
- If you're not eligible for the full bursary, you may still be awarded the placement travel allowance
- Paid in three instalments one each term
- You will need to reapply each year





### **Interviews**

#### If you are applying for:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Operating Department Practice (ODP)
- Paramedic Science
- Social Work

You will be required to attend an interview.

### Occupational Health Checks:

Questionnaire which needs to be completed fully and honestly. Confidential process and assessed individually.

Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Disclosure:

Essential that you are open and honest about any previous convictions, even if they are 'spent'

Second references:

Professional bodies require a second reference to demonstrate 'Good Character'



## How we'll assess your application

We will make you an offer that's tailored to you and your application and will look at more than just your academic performance when making you an offer and deciding whether to accept you on the course.

Depending on the course you apply for we'll look at:

- your grades and other academic experience
- work and other experience
- Personal statement
- Your performance at an interview/selection test
- An academic/professional reference (Health & Social Care courses only)

#### AccessBU

If you don't have traditional qualifications, or are unable to meet the entry requirements, we may be able to make you an offer through AccessBU if you meet certain criteria e.g. you have been in care or live in an area where fewer people typically progress to Higher Education. Your offer could be 16 points below the published tariff.
