





Choosing the right place and course for you

- Location large city, small town, coastal or the countryside

- Entry requirements are there required subjects and/or

Entry Requirements

Our offer will be based on our **tariff points range**, meaning **flexibility** about your grades.

You will need to have a minimum of 2 A-levels or equivalent. We will also consider additional study, such as the Extended Project Qualification. General Studies is usually excluded from our offer.

- Check they are happy to be a referee and add their details to your application
- UCAS will share a link and password to your referee to complete online

For NHS courses you will need to provide a second reference, this is not sent with your UCAS application

Determination

- A clear reason and motivation for applying to the course
- Your enthusiasm for the subject area
- Your career plans and future employment opportunities

<u>R</u>esilience

- An ability to cope with the demands of study
- Evidence of your strong organisational skills
- Your ability to work under pressure
- Your ability to work independently





<u>Insight</u>

- A clear insight into the subject area/profession and an ability to reflect on any research undertaken
- Relevant professionals you have spoken to
- Reading you have undertaken
- Lectures/talks you have attended

<u>V</u>alues

- An understanding of the values and skills required by the course/profession
- Your ability to problem solve and work in a team
- Your strong communication skills
- How you share the NHS values

NHS values

- Working together for patients
- Respect and dignity
- Commitment to quality of care
- Compassion
- Improving lives
- Everyone counts



Experience

- An ability to reflect on learning from relevant experiences
- What relevant experience you have, including:
 - Shadowing
 - Caring for a family member/friend
 - Volunteering experience

Any insights into:

- The field of practice you are interested in
- What it is like to work in an operating department/ambulance/first response environment, or social work/social care capacity <u>Or</u>
- The role of a Midwife



Personal statements - final thoughts

- Structure your points
 - A activity, ability or achievement
 - B benefit what have you learnt
 - C how is this relevant to the course
- Check spelling and grammar
- Be explicit about your skills and qualities
- Seek others' opinions and advice
- Don't be untruthful!
- Don't include details specific to one of your five choices
- Conclusion

How we'll assess your application

We will make you an offer that's tailored to you and your application and will look at more than just your academic performance when making you an offer and deciding whether to accept you on the course.

Depending on the course you apply for we'll look at:

- your grades and other academic experience
- work and other experience
- Personal statement
- Your performance at **an interview/selection** test
- An academic/professional reference (Health & Social Care courses only)

AccessBU

If you don't have traditional qualifications, or are unable to meet the entry requirements, we may be able to make you an offer through AccessBU if you meet certain criteria e.g. you have been in care or live in an area where fewer people typically progress to Higher Education. Your offer may be one grade below the published tariff.
