

9 You'll finish your tour by looking at another of our accommodation options. Leave the EBC and look to your left.

You'll be able to see the Asda supermarket, which is ideally located for students living in Lansdowne.

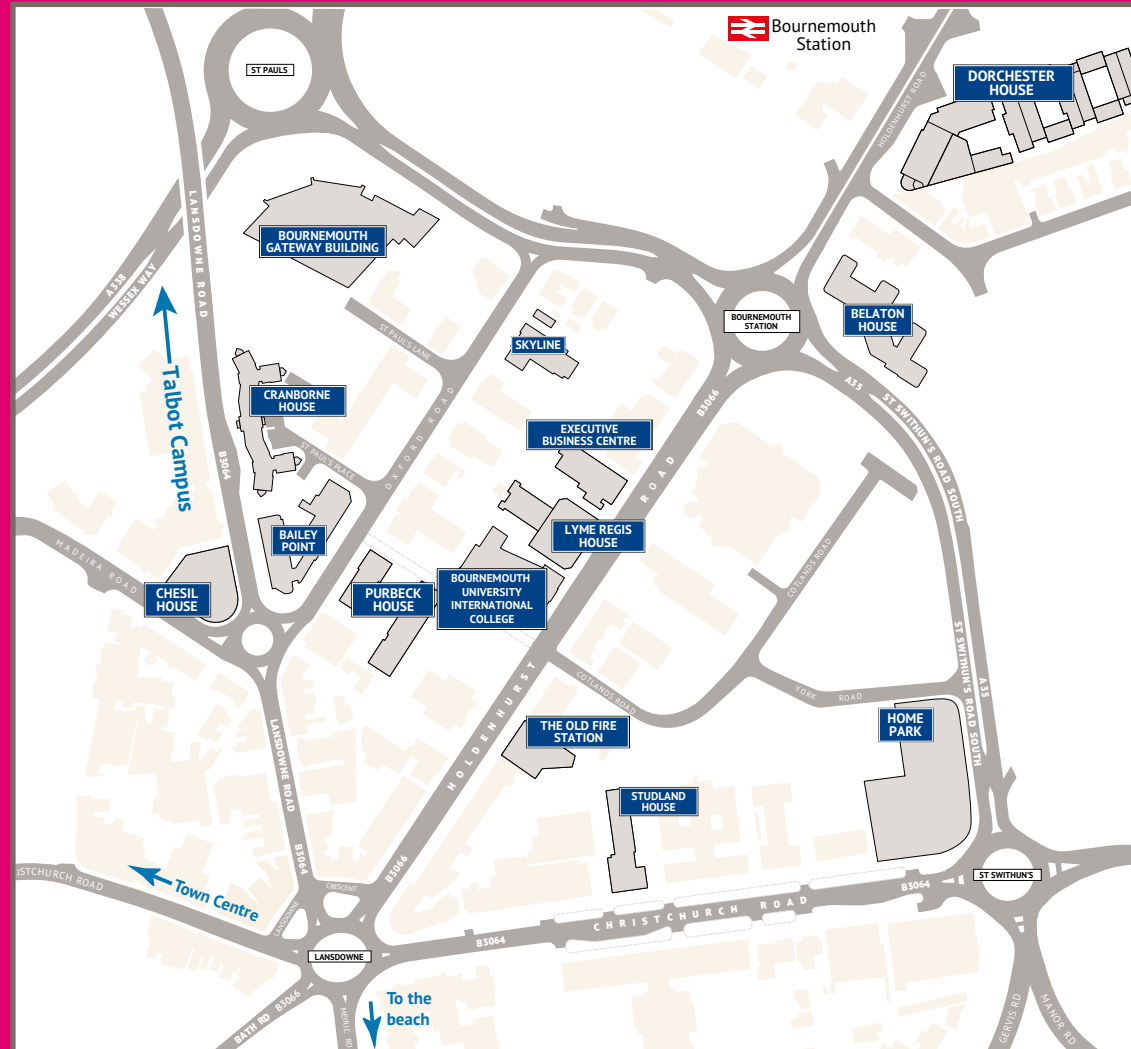
Just over the road from Asda is **Dorchester House**. The flats in **Dorchester House** are clustered into groups of three to seven, all with a large kitchen and living space.



Where will the rest of your tour take you?

If you carry on walking down this road for five minutes, you will reach the Railway Station, where coaches, buses and trains connect Bournemouth with the rest of the UK.

Alternatively, you might like to explore the area. If you turn around and head back towards the Post Office and Lansdowne Roundabout, the third exit will take you to the seafront (approximately ten minutes' walk), the fourth exit off the roundabout will take you down to **Bournemouth Pier** (approximately 15 minutes' walk) and the fifth exit will take you into the **town centre** (approximately 15 minutes' walk).

1 Your tour starts on St Paul's Lane with the Bournemouth Gateway Building.

The new Bournemouth Gateway Building is a unified base for the Faculty of Health & Social Sciences.

To your right as you enter, you'll find a café open to the general public as well as the BU community. On your left you will find our AskBU Students' Service. Our advisers are on-hand with advice and guidance for current students.

The building offers our students and staff the latest specialist equipment for their education and research. This includes simulation rooms such as:

- An operating theatre
- Hospital wards, including an acute ward
- A residential flat for simulating care in the home scenarios
- A maternity birthing room
- Other skills labs for physiotherapy, occupational therapy and paramedic (ambulance) simulation
- A hi-tech interactive anatomage table allowing students to look at and manipulate the human body
- An MRI scanner, which is also used to train local practitioners.



2 From reception, you can look up and see the different floors.

There is a lecture theatre, library and a range of study spaces for independent and collaborative working in the **Bournemouth Gateway Building**.

The Lansdowne office for the Students' Union (SUBU), is based here, along with a private SUBU room that is used for face-to-face meetings.

To protect our specialist equipment, the reception area is as far as the tour of this building will take you. You can view more of the facilities via our Virtual Tour.

3 From the Bournemouth Gateway Building, take a right down Oxford Road to see some accommodation options.

Located on Oxford Road are **Bailey Point**, with a roof terrace and a free onsite gym, and **Purbeck House** accommodation blocks. These are popular with our students because they are ideally located for the town centre, as well as being close to the bus stop to get to our Talbot Campus easily.



4 Keep walking in the same direction until you reach the roundabout. At the roundabout, take in the sights mentioned below, then head left at the roundabout.

You'll see a building with red, blue and yellow windows above The Co-operative supermarket. This is **Chesil House**, which has 210 bedrooms, including 24 self-contained studio apartments.

The UNIBUS frequently stops outside **Chesil House**. This is a subsidised bus service between the **Talbot** and **Lansdowne campuses**, extending to Bournemouth, Boscombe and Poole. Buses run up to every 10 minutes between campuses during term times. If you'd also like to explore our **Talbot Campus**, you might like to use the bus to get you there.

Just opposite the bus stop is another Halls of Residence, **Cranborne House**, which has 497 rooms in cluster flats of six and seven.



5 At the next roundabout, where you can see the KFC, take a left past the Post Office. You'll see The Old Fire Station on the opposite side of the road.

This is the Students' Union's nightclub and venue. If you feel it's time for a coffee stop, pop in to find **The Engine Room** café, which is open during term time.



6 Continue up Holdenhurst Road and you'll pass the BU International College on your left, which offers preparatory courses in academic and English skills for international students looking to progress to BU.



Lansdowne Point's restaurant, **Naked Deli**, has a tasty daily menu, including halal and vegetarian options and BU students can use their discount. Talbot Campus/BU loyalty cards are also accepted.

7 Past the BU International College, you'll find a Tesco Express, above which is Lyme Regis House, another stop on our Halls of Residence tour.

This building houses 400 students, consisting of 10 self-contained studios and 390 rooms in five-bedroom cluster flats.



8 The next part of your tour takes you to the Executive Business Centre (EBC). You'll find the EBC next door to Lyme Regis House and the Tesco Express.



The **EBC** is used by the Bournemouth University Business School to deliver some of its postgraduate courses.

As you enter the EBC, you'll see a café. At the back of the café is ORIBU, BU's Orthopaedic Research Institute, which aims to make a real difference to people's lives not only here in Dorset but globally. Also located here is the ORI Gait Lab which allows researchers from across BU faculties to study human motion with the aim of improving sporting performance and treating injury and arthritis.



On the **first floor** of this building is the i-floor, a paperless work space with a huge range of electronic materials. Students also have access to technoboosts, an ideal space for group work. Also on the first floor is the **Doctoral College**, which offers a space for research students.

The **seventh floor** is home to our **MBA and Executive Education area** and has flexible social spaces as well as **lecture and seminar rooms**. These are equipped with plasma screens, networked PCs and interactive 'smartboard' technology.
