AIMS

This unit will allow students to develop an understanding of mental health issues in older people, and consider approaches to the assessment of mental health needs.

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

Having completed this unit the student is expected to:

- 1. Discuss ways in which normal ageing affects the mental health of an individual
- 2. Explore approaches to the assessment of common mental health problems within older people
- 3. Describe the presentation of common mental health problems within older people
- 4. Analyse the impact that mental health problems in older people have on families and carers
- 5. Critically evaluate integrated policy approaches to the care of older people with mental health problems

LEARNING AND TEACHING METHODS

The unit will be delivered through a combination of lectures, seminars, e learning, independent reading and study.

INDICATIVE CONTENT

- Mental health and emotional wellbeing in older age
 - The impact of physical health issues on the mental health of an individual
 - The social exclusion of older people with mental health needs; poverty, social isolation, lack of engagement
- Common mental health problems in older people; risk factors, presentation, formulation:
 - o depression and anxiety, suicide and self harm
 - differential diagnosis mentioning delirium, depression and dementia but with an emphasis on depression
 - o alcohol and drug problems; issues with prescribed medication
 - o other mental health problems: schizophrenia, bipolar disorder
 - o confusion
- Assessment processes
 - Risk and risk assessment
 - The single assessment process; integrated assessment, the care programme approach
- Recovery principles in older peoples mental health
- Policy initiatives; Integrated care
- Mental capacity, the Mental Capacity Act 2005
