- BU is ranked amongst the top 10 best UK universities for journalism, publishing and PR (The best UK universities 2021 league table - The Guardian).



Two BU Multimedia Journalism students nominated in the Independent Radio News awards

Two BA (Hons) Multimedia Journalism students have been nominated in the Independent Radio News awards in association with Sky News.

The Awards celebrate the achievements of news and sports journalists in UK commercial radio in a wide range of categories including news reading, reporting, campaigns and interviews. The nominations were announced by Sky News presenter Anna Jones ahead of a Special video ceremony to be held on Thursday 15 July where the winners and the recipient

Of the 12 categories, Bournemouth University students Jeannine Hyde and Kayleigh Heckford were both shortlisted for 'Student Journalist of the Year' after submitting their final

Level 6 student Jeannine Hyde produced a radio documentary on deepfake pornography and Kayleigh Heckford, recently graduated, produced a radio documentary last year about how women attending abortion clinics are abused and suffer harassment.



Placements

- Gaining practical experience as a journalism student is vital, so the placement element of the course is mandatory. You will begin your placement after completion of your second year of study, this is a 4-week compulsory placement if you choose to study for 3 years or a minimum 30-week placement if you choose to study for 4 years, 2 weeks of which must be in broadcast.
- You could even choose to undertake your <u>placement abroad</u>, giving you the opportunity to develop yourself personally, academically, and professionally and gain skills to help you stand out in the job market.


