

Our students are a **key part of the research** we conduct, co-creating knowledge with us and playing a crucial role in everything that we do.




At BU, our **research environment** supports the research capacity and capability of staff at all stages of their career.

What is a Research degree?

Postgraduate Taught Master's degree (PGT)

- Like undergraduate degrees
- Complete a series of units
- Follow a set timetable
- Study independently in your free time
- Lectures will lead you through your course

Postgraduate Research degree (PGR)

- More independent in nature
- No timetabled units or regular teaching sessions
- Focus on a single in-depth research project
- Supervised by experts
- Responsibility for your work is on you

What are the entry requirements?

Master by Research (MRes) and Master of Philosophy (MPhil):

• A first or upper second class (2:1) honours UK Bachelor's degree, or overseas equivalent, in a discipline which is appropriate to the proposed research

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD):

- A first or upper second class (2:1) honours UK Bachelor's degree, or overseas equivalent, in a discipline which is appropriate to the proposed research, or
- A UK Master's degree, or overseas equivalent, in a discipline which is appropriate to the proposed research.
- Candidates for whom English is not their first language must have an IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 minimum (with a minimum 6.0 in each component, or equivalent)



Fees and funding

Fees for 2025/26

- Full-time Home: £4,683
- Part-time Home: £2,432
- Full-time overseas: £20,000 (Lib)
- Full-time overseas: £23,000 (Lab)
- Completion status: £600

Funding options

- Self-funded
- Externally funded (e.g. employer)
- BU funded (e.g. studentship)
- Postgraduate loan (student finance)





Start dates

Three main entry points for research degrees annually:

- September
- January
- April

Application windows

The application windows close as follows:

- September intake 16 June
- January intake 31 October
- April intake 31 January
