Do I have to pay to attend?

No!

Our Summer Schools are completely free of charge for you to attend. We will provide all food, accommodation and activities whilst you are with us.

How do I apply?

Complete an application form

You can apply via the form on our website, please see the link at the bottom of this page. Part of the application should be completed by a parent or carer so make sure they are nearby when you are completing the form.

When is the deadline?

Friday, 9 June 2023, at 5:00pm

It's really important that you complete your application by this date so that we can assess your eligibility for the summer school.

Why do you ask for my teacher's details?

We will ask them for a reference

We ask you to supply the name and email address of a teacher who knows you well at your school so that they can share a short support statement to ensure the summer school would be beneficial for you to attend.

How do you decide who gets a place?

Using the answers on your form

The questions you answer help us to assess each application against our targeting criteria. We will prioritise applications from those who are less likely to go to university in the future. Please note if you have attended one of our summer schools before you can not attend a second time.

How will I get there?

We will help you organise your travel

If you are successful in gaining a place on the residential we will contact you to arrange travel to us and back home and we may be able to provide you with travel funding to help you attend.

Where will I stay?

Accommodation is included

You will stay with your fellow summer school students in our university halls of residence in Bournemouth. You will have your own ensuite room within a flat with a shared kitchen.
