The Objects of the Charity

Grant-Making Policies & Procedures

The Trustees target their grants at projects that are nurse-led and focused on supporting the nursing contribution to healthcare.

Building Nursing Research Capacity: supporting clinical nursing research and research addressing policy, leadership development and delivery of nursing care.

Building Nurse Leadership Capacity: supporting nurses in their professional development to create a cadre of excellent nursing and allied health professionals who will become leaders of the future and foster excellence and capacity-building in advancing the nursing profession.

Supporting Local Nurse-led Initiatives: supporting nurse-led initiatives that make a difference at local level and are focused explicitly on improving care for patients and users of services.
