BA (Hons) and MA Social Work



Social work degree

- 3 year undergraduate degree or 2 year postgraduate degree which leads to an academic and professional qualification in social work
- We work in partnership with stakeholders service users and carers; employers; professional bodies (HCPC); employers; practitioners; and students;



Key themes

- Valuing diversity and anti- oppressive practice. Social work values are integral in teaching and learning (See the British Association of Social Workers code of ethics)
- Balance between learning in placement and in the university: 170 days in a practice setting
- Active and thoughtful integration of theory and practice



Key themes

Research-informed teaching and learning – the programme team are research active and this keeps the curriculum fresh and up to date

Entry Requirements

- (BA) Age 18 or over on September 1st in the year of entry to the programme
- (BA) Ability to study at degree level (Please see the information sheet which details the number of points and the range of qualifications. English and Numerical skills are essential).
- (MA) A 2.1, or above, degree
- Preferably an understanding of social sciences



Entry Requirements continued

- Aptitude for Social Work demonstrated through
 - Life experience
 - Voluntary work experience
 - Paid social care experience

(NB in addition to that required to achieve your entry qualifications)

- Health Checks
- Full criminal records disclosure



Application Process

- Complete UCAS form
- Shortlisting for possible interview
- Complete supplementary application form
- Selections made for interview
- Invitations sent out



Interview day

- Introduction
- Meeting with current students
- Group exercise
- Written exercise
- Individual interview with a lecturer and social work practitioner
