- **Qualifications (achieved & predicted)**
- **Personal statement**
- Teacher or individual reference*

Institutions & Providers will consider the application They will make a decision to

- Offer (Conditional/Unconditional)
- **Interview** (other selection measures)
- Reject

You will make your final decisions

- Firm
- Insurance
- Reject remaining choices

Your results are considered

- Confirm
- Insurance
- Decline

Start applying from Sept

Applications to Oxford & Cambridge 15 Oct

Get your application in by...

15 Jan

You can still apply late up until the end of the cycle 30 Jun

UCAS Extra opens 25 Feb

Some Art & Design courses apply by 24 Mar

You should receive a decision by

31 Mar

Make your firm & insurance choice by

4 May

Confirmation. **Clearing &** Adjustment (from early July)

17 Aug

Applications cycle formally closes 30 Jun

All remaining applications through Clearing



Things to think about

Is it the right course for you?

- What is the balance of coursework/exams?
- How much assessment by group work?
- Opportunities for workplace or applied studies?
- Fieldwork and practical learning?

Will you meet the entry requirements?

- Required/Relevant subjects?
- Required minimum grades?
- Maths & English GCSE?

Relevant subject:

An indication of subjects that would be relevant to the course – <u>not</u> an entry requirement

Required subject:

Part of the <u>entry</u>
<u>requirement</u> – you
must be studying one
of these



Making the application

Personal Statement

- ✓ Good vocabulary and structure
- ✓ Course and beyond
- ✓ Career
- **✓** Roles & responsibilities
- ✓ Work experience
- ✓ Year out

...all of that in 4,000 characters (including spaces) or 47 lines.





Vocabulary and Structure

- Positive language sell yourself!
- Preparation bullet points then rough draft
- Simple rule Whenever you say you have a skill or quality - demonstrate how, where, when you acquired it

for example, team work



Course

- State the reasons for your choice of course
- Enjoy the subject State why?
- Enjoy particular aspects Which aspects?
- Talk about the subjects you are currently studying, and try to describe links between them
- Tell us how you are developing the skills the course requires





Roles & responsibilities

- Drama productions, voluntary work, prefect, team captain, fundraising, event organiser, school rep.
- Top tip don't take up too much of the form telling us about these unless relevant!


Work experience

- Think about what you have done outside of school/college that shows your commitment
- Any relevant work experience? Excellent particularly if relevant and organised on your own initiative
- Attended any workshops/short courses?



Final Thoughts

- Check spelling and grammar
- Make the space count prioritise
- Be explicit about your skills and qualities
- Seek others' opinions and advice
- Don't be untruthful!
- Don't include details specific to one of your five choices
- It's your UCAS form!

Courses that interview:

- Midwifery
- Nursing
- Occupational Therapy
- Operating Department Practice
- Paramedic Science
- Physiotherapy
- Social Work

Courses that don't usually interview*:

Clinical Exercise Science

*Chance of interview at the discretion of the academic team.





Additional Information

Occupational Health Checks:

Questionnaire which needs to be completed fully and honestly. Confidential process and assessed individually.

Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Disclosure:

Essential that you are open and honest about any previous convictions, even if they are 'spent'

Second references:

Professional bodies require a second reference to demonstrate 'Good Character'
