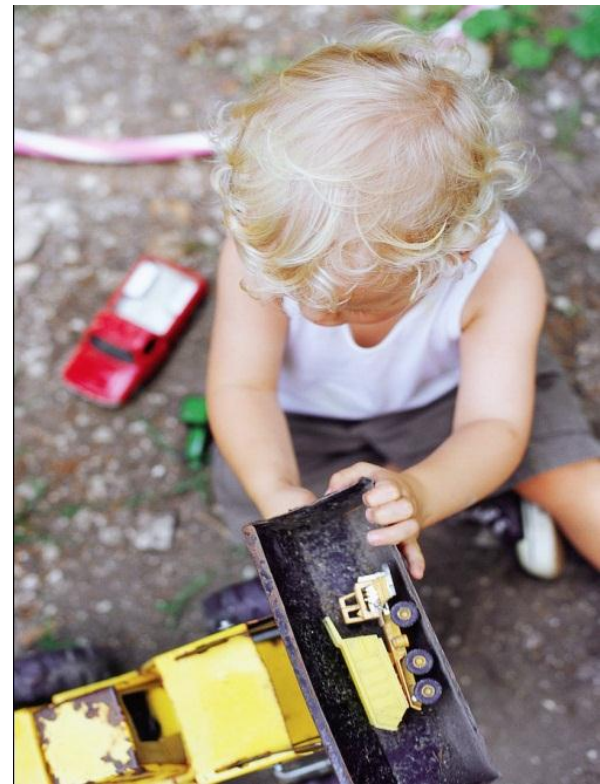

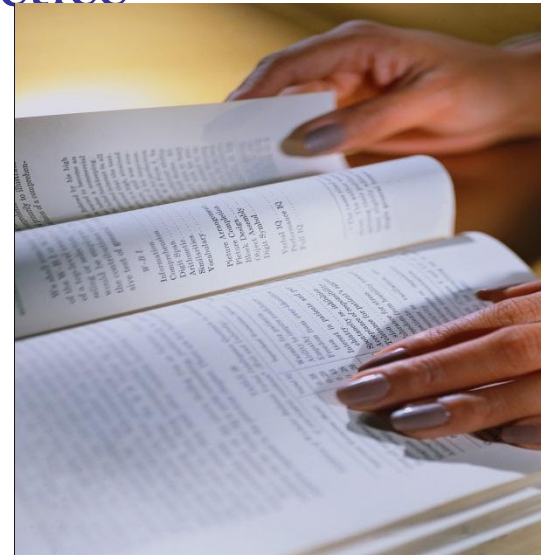

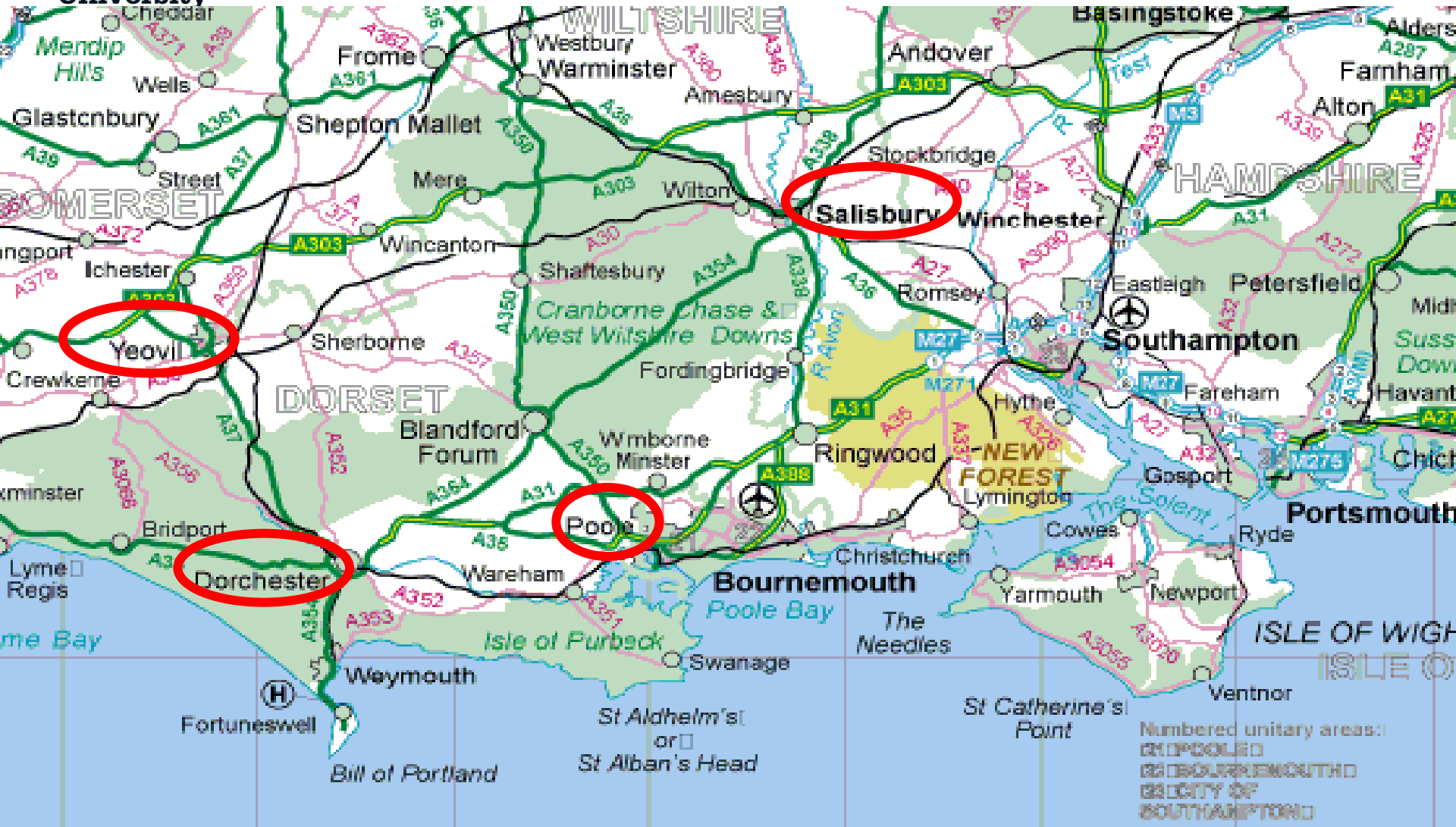

## *More about practice experience:*

- Practice experience will be gained in hospital & the community
- Students work with a designated mentor
- Requirement to work shifts including some weekends and night duty, to a total of 37.5 hours a week
- Advised to live near placement location
- Practice consolidation block at end of year 3
- Students will experience a different location for one placement during the 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- 3<sup>rd</sup> years are offered the opportunity to experience a placement abroad
