- Partnership between the nurse and the family



Programme designed to reflect:

An holistic and individualised approach to working with and caring for babies, children, young people and their family in a variety of settings





Programme Structure:

- Blocks' of theory and practice throughout ending with a 12 week practice consolidation period
- Attendance is paramount
- 7 weeks annual leave a year
- Comprises uniprofessional and interprofessional education

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

More about practice experience:

- Practice experience will be gained in hospital & the community
- Students work with a designated mentor
- Requirement to work shifts including some weekends and night duty, to a total of 37.5 hours a week
- Advised to live near placement location
- Practice consolidation block at end of year 3
- Students will experience a different location for one placement during the 2nd year
- 3rd years are offered the opportunity to experience a placement abroad

You will not repay your loan until you are earning £21,000 For band 5 this would be £5.25* a month


