

Electronic Theses Online Service (EThOS)

EThOS is a British Library service aimed at providing digital copies of UK PhD theses over the web. It is a database of the records of over 300,000 UK theses with the added functionality to enable the requesting of digital copies of selected theses.

You do not need to be registered with the system to search the database, but you will be required to register if you wish to request a digital copy of a thesis. Some theses are available for immediate download. You can also request a digital copy of a thesis even if it is not currently held on the system in digital format.

Many UK institutions support Open Access to their theses, so downloads of their digital and digitised theses is free to the researcher. Bournemouth University is an Open Access sponsor. A small number of participating institutions may not be able to offer Open Access and in this case there will be a cost to supply a digital copy.

Where a thesis must be digitised before supply, you can expect a short delay. However, you will be informed when the thesis is ready for collection and you can then log on to the system and download it. The theses are supplied as zipped pdfs. Alternative formats (CD or paper) are also available for purchase.

EThOS can only offer the theses of participating institutions. Whilst it is expected that a large number of institutions will participate, British Library cannot supply from an institution which chooses not to. In this case, it may be possible to obtain a copy via BU Library's Inter Library Loan Service.

Notes:

- 1. For copyright reasons, BU Library cannot download theses on your behalf. The researcher who is going to use the thesis needs to do this, and at the same time agree to the download terms and conditions;
- 2. If the digital copy is priced, researchers should submit an Inter Library Loan form to BU Library who will purchase the digital copy on their behalf. You will be advised when a digital copy is available for download;
- 3. Where an alternative format to a digital copy is required (CD or paper), the cost must be paid by the researcher.
