Bournemouth University (BU) launched a Developing Women Leaders pilot Programme (DWL) aimed at final year business and management students. The goal of the DWL is to offer participants an opportunity to reflect on some of the gendered discrimination that occurs within the workplace. As such, the aim is to raise awareness of some of these issues before women enter organisational life and benefit from learning and experience of external speakers. This programme also forms the basis of a qualitative research project, which aims to evaluate impact and investigate some of the issues / challenges that these groups of students are concerned about.

FoodSmart: Think smart, eat smarter

Professor Hartwell will present an innovative project that will transform health. Compared to meals prepared at

home, meals eaten out tend to contain more calories, total fat and saturated fat and it is here where the consumer has very little knowledge of the nutrient profile of the dish they are eating. The workshop will introduce the EU funded FoodSmart project and allow participants to test the next generation of prototype by using the Android system application.
