Why Specialise?

Business Law – Focuses on the legal implications of business and the skills that employers are looking for in that context, including, commercial awareness, initiative and good communication.

Entertainment Law – Niche specialism in the area of media regulation and drawing on the departments leading expertise in the area of *Intellectual Property Law*.

Law & Taxation: Focuses on the rules, policies and laws that oversee the tax process, which involves charges on estates, transactions, property, income, licenses and more by the government and which draws on our tax expertise in the area.

Law & Economics: Economic theory serves as a rationale for the law and its development. Students gain an understanding of that relationship, as well as of another discipline alongside the study of a qualifying law degree
