

Research degree funding

Fully-funded Studentships

- Receive a stipend of £14,000 per year for 3 years
- Receive a fee waiver for 36 months

Vice-Chancellor's PhD Scholarship

- Full tuition fee waiver
- Allocated by each Faculty to outstanding applicants
- Apply at same time of application

Entry requirements

- For entry onto a postgraduate research degree, you will usually be required to have a Master's degree and Upper Second Class (2:1) Honours degree. However, if you have a 1st class degree or can demonstrate, through publications or academic references, that you are capable of working towards a research degree, you may be considered without a Master's qualification.
- Some supervisors may ask you for additional entry requirements such as relevant work experience, evidence of written work, or previous study of a particular subject.

If English isn't your first language

IELTS (Academic) 6.5 with minimum 5.5 in each component or equivalent.

Pre-sessional English courses available through our Partner Institution, Bournemouth University International College.

- Apply directly for specific project via online application system on our website

PhDs supported by other funding souces

- Research our areas of expertise to see if we have appropriate supervisors for your PhD
- Contact our Admissions Team with a brief summary of what you would like to study
- Complete online application form

Application deadlines

- For the autumn term (starting in September): mid-June
- For the spring term (starting in January): mid-October
- For the summer term (starting in April): mid-January
