Please note: "BU was where Honours / elective classes in relevant or required subjects will support your application, as will an associate degree in I needed to be". a relevant subject with a minimum GPA of 2.5 out of 4.0. We have registered with (Alex Parker, Texas) the College Board to receive SAT and AP scores. To send your results through the College Board, you will need to select Bournemouth University's Designated Institution code, which is 7427. Admissions

What are the admissions requirements?

You can apply to study a Bachelor's degree from year one if you hold a High School Graduation Diploma with a GPA between 3.0 and 3.5 out of 4.0, depending on the course you applied for. You will also need at least one of the following:

- SAT Reasoning tests | SATR tests are accepted only on courses in which all subjects are considered. You will need a combined score between 1700 and 1800 (pre-March 2016) or between 1200 and 1300 (post-March 2016). The required score will vary according to the course applied for.
- American College Tests | ACT tests are accepted only on courses in which all subjects are considered. You will need a combined score between 24 and 29, depending on the course applied for.
- SAT Subject tests | SATS tests are required on courses which list required or relevant subjects. You will need 2 or 3 tests and the required score per subject will range between 575 and 640, depending on the course applied for. Additional tests such as SATR or ACT will support your application.
- Advanced Placement tests | AP tests are required on courses
 which list required or relevant subjects. You will need 2 tests
 and the required score per subject will range between 3 and 5,
 depending on the course applied for. Additional tests such as
 SATR or ACT will support your application.



What qualities should prospective students have?

Academic qualifications are certainly an important part of your application to study at university, but this is not the only factor we take into account when assessing applications. We look at each application on an individual basis and offer places based on your potential to succeed on the course you're applying for. The other factors we consider when assessing applications are:


- Any work or other experience you have that is relevant to the course you're interested in
- · Personal achievements
- The reference you provide with your application
- Your personal statement

- Your passion and enthusiasm for the subject you're applying to study
- In some cases, we will also invite you to attend an interview and/or selection test. How you perform may have an impact on your application.

What are the most popular majors for US students at BU?

The three most popular subject areas for US students are Computer Animation & Visual Effects, Media & Communication and Sciences. However, majors in Sports and Tourism and Hospitality & Events are increasing in popularity.





What are the application deadlines for admission?

If you are applying for a full-time undergraduate course (including Top-up degrees) you will need to submit your application through the **UCAS** (Universities and Colleges Admission Service) website. Our institution code is B50.

Applications for undergraduate courses starting in September begin in mid-September of the previous year. The deadline for applications for the majority of courses is the June prior to the September when you start your course. You'll find a full timetable of dates on the **UCAS site**. Are interviews and portfolio required?

Individual Skype interviews and / or portfolios will be required for some of our courses in Computer Animation & Visualisation and Design & Engineering. Sometimes the academic assessing your application for any other course might ask for a Skype interview if they need to speak to you directly before making a decision.

How can I arrange a campus visit?

An Open Day is the best opportunity for you to get an idea of what it's like to study at Bournemouth University and what it's like to live in this beautiful seaside town.

Applying via CommonApp



How long should I expect to wait for an answer once I have submitted my application?

It will take at least 48 hours for us to receive your application once you have submitted it via UCAS (up to 7 working days for applications received from CommonApp). We will then aim to make an initial decision within 10 working days. If your application is incomplete or if we need any further information from you, it will take longer to make a decision. It is important that you always check myHub, our applicant portal, and respond to any requests as soon as possible. Some courses will require an interview and / or portfolio submission, which will also affect the time it takes for a decision to be made.



What documents should I submit with my application?

The more complete your application is, the faster a decision will be made. A complete application should contain the following documents uploaded to myHub at the moment of submission:

- · Copy of your final or current High School transcript
- Copy of your High School Diploma should you have already completed it
- One academic reference
- · One personal statement
- · A copy of your passport
- Official scores for required / relevant tests such as SATR, SATS, APs and ACT. You will also need to ask College Board to send the score sheet to us directly. Our Designated Institution code is 7427.

How do I write a personal statement?

Writing a personal statement is one of the hardest parts of the application process because it requires you to really think creatively about how you present yourself to a host of people who have never met you before. You need to make it stand out in all the right ways and, of course, showcase your skills. On your personal statement, please include:

- Your reasons for applying to the course and how it will benefit you in the future
- · Your reasons for applying to study at BU
- Emphasise where you have achieved an exemplary standard in your studies and how it relates to your course
- · Your career aspirations upon completion of your course
- What motivates you and how it relates to the course you are applying for
- Relevant extracurricular activities (voluntary work, paid work, hobbies, interests, etc).

How do I write an academic reference?

Your reference letter should:

- Be written by a tutor who knows you well
- Demonstrate how you can cope with the academic demands of the course
- · Include your grade predictions
- Explain any possible low performance during your studies
- Emphasize your strengths and how they relate to the course you are applying for
- Compare your performance to the overall performance of other students in your class / school
- Give a brief and relevant profile of your school (in a separate document).

Financial support

How much will it cost?

• The international tuition fee for all undergraduate courses (majors) at BU is currently £13,750 per year. This excludes any other expenses, such as housing, subsistence, transportation, etc.

If you apply for a US Federal Loan, BU will send you a letter
to send with your Tier 4 student visa application. You will not
need to provide any other financial documents with your visa
application. We have a webpage explaining the process of

not applying for a US Federal loan, you will need to meet the
UKVI requirements for maintenance.



When is the scholarship application deadline?

There is no deadline for the BU Academic Excellence Scholarship. The deadline for the BU Sports Scholarships and BU Music Scholarships is the end of August.



Accommodation



What type of accommodation is available?

There are seven types of housing to choose from: BU halls of residence, Student Village, Unilets and privately provided halls of residence. It will help you understand the booking process if you check our accommodation information web page.

Is student housing guaranteed for four years?

Student housing is only available during the first year. For the remaining period of your studies you are expected to find private accommodation. You can rent by yourself or share with other students.

Would I have a roommate or live alone?

During the first year, students will have a private bedroom with en-suite and will share kitchen and living spaces with other students. There are between 4-6 bedrooms in each flat.

How are flatmates selected?

The accommodation booking process consists of 2 stages: In stage 1 students will register and create a profile, which will give a little bit of information about themselves. In stage 2, students will be able to pick flats and read the profile of other students who have chosen the same flat.

What are the sports facilities like?

What is the average class size?

This will vary according to the course. Lectures are larger groups of up to 100 students, and seminars are usually no bigger than 20-25 students. These numbers reduce significantly for courses where lab work is required.

How accessible are teachers outside of class?

Apart from face-to-face contact during classes and seminars, you can book one-to-one tutorials with teachers without difficulty. However, be aware that in the UK students are expected to do a significant amount of independent studies.
