

Finance support from 2017

From September 2017 the finance support is changing

- Tuition fees will no longer be paid
- You won't receive a bursary or grant

You'll be able to access the same financial support as other non-NHS courses:

- A tuition fee loan from Student Finance England
- A maintenance loan of up to £10,410

You won't repay your loan until you're earning £21,000
For band 5 this would be £5.25* a month

New loan will provide you with 33% more money* = more disposable income

Additional support from Student Finance England

• Childcare grant:

- Up to £159.59 a week for 1 child
- Up to £273.60 a week for 2 children or more
- Additional grant of up to £1,000 available from Department of Health
- Parents' Learning Allowance:
 - Up to £1,617 a year to support learning costs (doesn't affect benefits or tax credits)
- Adult Dependents' Grant:
 - Up to £2,834 a year
- Child tax credit:
 - Up to £2,780 a year for each child
- Disabled Student's Allowance:
 - Up to £1,790 a year (general allowance), additional funding available for specialist equipment and non-medical helper allowance

The Programme at BU




- Intake Sept & Feb
